*****BUDGET WORKSHOP MEETING-6:30 P.M.

In preparation of the 2013 Municipal Budget the first budget workshop meeting was called to order this evening at 6:30 PM. A second budget workshop meeting will be held on Monday, February 11, 2013 at 6:30 PM and the regular business meeting scheduled for that date will begin at 7:30 PM.

Also present were Municipal Clerk Barbara L. Young, Finance Officer Barbara Spiegel, and Municipal Engineer Paul Dietrich.

The Open Public Meeting notice was read into the record.

Mr. Corson began the meeting by stating that currently the 2013 proposed Budget is under CAP and is \$250,000 from having no increase in the local purpose tax. He suggested that they go through the budget line item by line item and discuss possible cuts.

Township Clerk - It was discussed that the O/E line item in the budget has been allocated at \$45,000. However, actual expenditures have been much less for the past few years. There was a general consensus to reduce the O/E line item by \$5,000.

Financial Administration – It was discussed that the Computer Services line item increased to \$57,200.00 because of a proposal to video record the Committee Meetings. It was decided to reduce the Computer Services line item by \$5,000 due to a savings resulting from a change in Webmaster Services.

Legal Services – There was a general consensus to reduce the Special Litigation line item by \$25,000.

Affordable Housing – It was decided that because the Other Expenses line item was not used last year, it will be reduced by \$10,000.

Capital Improvements - There was a brief discussion on the Road Construction/Reconstruction line item. This being a bondable item, it was decided to remove this appropriation.

Mr. Corson stated that based on decisions made tonight the total operations appropriations were reduced by \$295,000. There was a brief discussion on whether there is a potential for cost savings by performing Regional Dispatch Services in house. It was stated that with equipment and labor costs, savings would not be feasible at this time.

Mr. Corson then opened up the meeting for public comment. There being no public comment a motion was then made by Curtis Corson, seconded by Jay Newman, to adjourn the Budget Workshop. During roll call vote all five Committee Members voted in the affirmative. A Budget and Capital Bond Projects Workshop meeting is scheduled for February 11, 2013 at 6:30 pm.

There was a 7 minute recess and then the regular meeting convened.

<u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u> - January 14, 2013 Regular Meeting and Closed Session Minutes- Motion by Jay Newman,

second by Ed Barr to approve the closed session and regular minutes as submitted. During roll call vote four members voted in the affirmative. Richard Palombo abstained.

REPORT OF GOVERNING BODY MEMBERS

Richard Palombo, Mayor, announced that the New Jersey Supreme Court has denied the Citizens for Strathmere and Whale Beach petition of appeal. He commended Township Attorney Daniel Young for all of his hard work over the years as lead attorney for this matter. Mr. Palombo also commended Special Legal Counsel Frank Corrado, and the Township's Planning Board attorney, Dean Marcolongo. Mayor Palombo stated that the Committee is

ready to move forward and continue working for the benefit of Strathmere residents and residents of the entire Township. Mayor Palombo again offered his thanks to the Township Attorney.

He next reported on a meeting he and Mr. Newman had with South Jersey Gas Company regarding the transition of the BL England Generating Station to natural gas. Currently the project is in the preliminary stages of obtaining the necessary permits and it is anticipated that the project will be completed by the end of 2014. The conversion will extend the life of the BL England generating plant and ensure the Township continues to receive much needed energy receipt tax revenue. Mayor Palombo next reported on a few opportunities to expand the distribution of public information to residents through the Township's website, UTTV, the reverse 911 system, and a proposal to broadcast the Committee meetings on UTTV or online.

Edward Barr, Committeeman, reported that the Township held it's free Rabies Clinic this past Saturday at Shore Veterinarians Animal Clinic at which time 152 Dogs and 22 Cats were vaccinated and over 100 dog licenses were purchased. The next Free Rabies Clinic will be held on February 23rd from 1:00 to 3:00 P.M. at Shore Veterinarians Animal Hospital.

Anthony Inserra, Committeeman, reported that although the type of trash receptacle required for use with the new trash truck has not yet been determined a few examples of proposed trash receptacles are available for the public to view at the Municipal Building.

Curtis Corson, Deputy Mayor, reported that the next Budget workshop and Capital Bond projects meeting is scheduled for February 11, 2013 at 6:30 pm. prior to the regular Committee meeting at 7:30 pm.

Jay Newman, Committeeman, reported that Lieutenant Richard Bumbera is now the new Station Commander at the Woodbine Barracks.

OTHER REPORTS

Daniel Young, Municipal Attorney, reported that there are several items for closed session; Personnel, Contract Negotiation-Right of entry agreement with the New Jersey Turnpike Authority and a Litigation matter-Tax Appeal-Ruth Management.

Paul Dietrich, Municipal Engineer, gave an update on the Affordable Housing Rehabilitation Program. Six projects have been completed and the mortgages have been filed with the County Clerk. Two are near completion, and three more are on the final bidding stages to commence work. Mr. Dietrich stated that 14 projects should be completed by the spring, as obligated under the Affordable Housing Plan. Mr. Dietrich next reported on a proposed shared services agreement with Cape May County for snow plowing. Under the proposal the Township would plow County roads that are within the Township but isolated from the main thoroughfares. The Township Attorney advised consulting with the Township's Risk Management Consultant to work out any potential liability, and compile the costs and risks to determine an appropriate value of the contract. It was stated that from a public safety standpoint, it makes sense to look into the feasibility of such an agreement. Mr. Dietrich will compile the information regarding liability and cost effectiveness and report

back at the next meeting under closed session. Mr. Dietrich next reported that Dennis Township has reached out to discuss entering into a Shared Services for a Recycling Coordinator. Currently they do not have a Recycling Coordinator; it is a requirement that every Municipality submit a yearly tonnage report that is certified by a Recycling Coordinator to the NJDEP. The Committee directed Mr. Dietrich to obtain a proposal from Dennis Township and report back at the next meeting under the closed session agenda.

RESOLUTION NO. 034-2013

RE: A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING ASSEMBLY BILL A-2753 AND SENATE BILL S-1923 REQUIRING DIRECT PAYMENT OF ENERGY TAXES TO MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT

WHEREAS, taxes on gas and electric utilities were originally collected by the host municipalities, and when the State made itself the collection agent for these taxes, it promised to dedicate the proceeds to municipal property tax relief; and

WHEREAS, just as municipalities collect property taxes for the benefit of school districts, counties and other entities; the State is supposed to collect Energy Taxes for the benefit of municipal governments; and

WHEREAS, for years, though, State officials have diverted funding from Energy Taxes to plug holes in the State budget and to fund State programs; and

WHEREAS, the cumulative impact of years of underfunding has left many municipalities with serious needs and burdensome property taxes; and

WHEREAS, municipalities lost \$331 million in combined Energy Tax and Consolidated Municipal Property Tax Relief Aid (CMPTRA) funding in Fiscal Years 2009, 2010, and 2011, while also being denied scheduled incremental funding; and

WHEREAS, as a result of these cuts, in a number of municipalities property taxes are higher now, despite the fact that they are spending less, proving that the State's diversion of tax relief funding has contributed to higher municipal property taxes; and

WHEREAS, A-2753, sponsored by Assemblymen Daniel Benson and Wayne DeAngelo, and S-1923, sponsored by Senator Linda Greenstein, would restore the \$331 million in municipal property tax relief funding, ensure that each municipality will be restored to the 2007 (SFY 2008) Energy Tax Receipts/CMPTRA level and adjust that amount to account for inflation.; and

WHEREAS, the bills would require certain energy tax receipts to be paid directly to municipalities and, thereby, would assure local property taxpayers compensation for hosting transmission facilities and lines that allow gas and electric energy corporations to serve customers and conduct business in our Garden State; and

WHEREAS, the time has come to restore to local budgets the millions in property tax relief that have been annually diverted to meet State needs; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Township of Upper salutes the sponsors for listening to the Mayors in their districts and all around New Jersey and for advancing this legislation; and be it further

RESOLVED, that we enthusiastically support and urge our State Legislators to pass A-2753/S-1923; and be it finally

WHEREAS, the Omnibus Transportation Employee Testing Act of 1991 became applicable to the Township of Upper in 1996 in accordance with 49 C.F.R. §382.115(B) and mandates drug and alcohol testing for employees holding commercial driver's licenses engaged in safety sensitive duties and further requires each employer to maintain a testing policy as required by 49 C.F.R. §382.401(C)(6)(ib); and

WHEREAS, the Township has previously determined to extend that policy to all employees working in hazardous or safety sensitive areas and also to public safety employees including the Division of EMS and Township lifeguards; and

WHEREAS, to administer such a program in accordance with the Federal rules, regulations and guidelines, it is necessary to employ the services of a firm possessing such specialized skill and training; and

WHEREAS, Pogue, Inc., t/a Pogue Safety & Health Consortium (hereinafter referred to as "Pogue"), has the required expertise and provides the same or similar services for several other municipalities; and

WHEREAS, Pogue has been performing such services in the Township of Upper since in or about May of 1996 and proposes to continue to provide such services; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee intends to engage the services of Pogue under a Professional Services Contract; and

WHEREAS, Pogue, Inc. t/a Pogue Safety & Health Consortium has completed and submitted a Business Entity Disclosure Certification which

certify that the contractor has not made any contributions to a political or candidate committee in the Township that would bar the award of this contract and that the contract will prohibit the contractor from making any contributions through the term of the contract; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has certified the availability of funds to permit said Contract to be entered into;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Upper, in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. The allegations of the preamble are incorporated herein by this reference.
- 2. Pogue has registered with the State of New Jersey pursuant to c.57, Laws of 2004 and has provided proof of that registration to the Township.
- 3. The proposed Professional Services Contract between the Township and Pogue, a copy of which is on file in the office of the Township Clerk, is approved and the Mayor and the Township Clerk are hereby authorized, directed and empowered to execute said Contract on behalf of the Township of Upper and the Township Clerk is further authorized, directed and empowered to seal said Contract with the seal of the Township of Upper.
- 4. The Township Clerk shall cause a Notice of Award of this Contract to be published in the official newspaper of the Township of Upper as required by N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5.
- 5. This Contract has been awarded without competitive bidding for the following reason or reasons:
- (A) Professional services of the type herein sought are of such a nature as to require a high degree of trust or confidence in the individual providing the service and, in fact, may require the creation of a confidential or fiduciary relationship between that individual and the municipality;

- (B) The services required are highly specialized or technical in nature;
- (C) The services require peculiar ability or skill and demand a high degree of specialized knowledge or expertise;
- (D) The services are such that their relative work must be judged by subjective considerations that are not susceptible of valuation by competitive bidding; and
- (E) The individual who will provide these services has demonstrated his competence and particular expertise in the services required.
- 6. This Resolution shall take effect immediately and shall be deemed retroactive to January 1, 2013.

She next inquired of damaged homes from Hurricane Sandy receiving lower tax assessments. It was stated that homes that were damaged in the hurricane are eligible to receive a temporary reduction in their property assessment until the home is repaired.

Russell Morano, 5 Red Oak Drive, Marmora, requested a resolution honoring the members of the Upper Township School Board for their work.
