Richard Palombo, Mayor, reported that today he had the great honor of being a mystery reader for the Upper Township Primary School first and second grade classes. He stated that the kids asked a lot of questions and he enjoyed himself greatly. He next reported that FEMA

has increased the allotment of money that will be available for pre-disaster mitigation. The Township has previously applied for these funds and will continue to apply. He next reported that the Township has recently initiated the CodeRED system which has replaced the reverse 911 system. A test of all of the numbers in the system will be held this month. A notification of the exact date and time will be announced and posted soon. All residents are encouraged to register with the CodeRED system. A link to register is on the Township's website. Later in the meeting Mayor Palombo requested authorization to allow the Captain of the Beach Patrol to appoint rookie guards prior to the next meeting in order to allow them to attend training before the 4th of July weekend. The appointments will be formalized in an appointing resolution at the next meeting.

I also include in my motion the estimated time and the circumstances under which the discussion conducted in closed session can be disclosed to the public as follows:

- A. It is anticipated that the matters discussed in closed session may be disclosed to the public upon the determination of the Township Committee that the public interest will no longer be served by such confidentiality.
- B. With respect to employment and personnel matters such discussions will be made public if and when formal action is taken or when the individuals involved consent that it can be made public.
- C. With respect to contract negotiations such matters will be made public when negotiations have ceased and there is no longer a reason for confidentiality.
- D. With respect to litigation matters such discussions will be made public when litigation is complete and the applicable appeal period has expired.
