<u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u> - April 28, 2014 Regular Meeting and Closed Session Minutes

Motion by Hobie Young, second by John Coggins, to adopt the April 28, 2014 Regular Meeting and Closed Session Minutes as submitted. During roll call vote all five Committee members voted in the affirmative.

REPORT OF GOVERNING BODY MEMBERS

John Coggins, Committeeman, reported that the Township was awarded a grant in the amount of \$172,000.00 from the New Jersey DOT for the Reconstruction of Bayview Drive Phase 2. Mr. Coggins next commended Barbara Spiegel and Paul Dietrich for finding a cost savings opportunity for the Township's utility expenditures.

Hobie Young, Committeeman, reported that the Tour De' Tuckahoe Bike-a-thon held last weekend had a great turnout and was a big success. He next briefly reported on the upcoming projects planned for Amanda's Field. He next reported that an increase in the insurance medical liability coverage for Baseball is required. He next reported on a request to have Pickleball at the Community Center during the winter months. Committeeman Young stated that Pickleball is a growing sport for senior citizens and he would like to look into designating it as a Township sponsored program. He will gather more information and bring the request before the Committee for formal action at a later date. He next gave a brief update on the preliminary plans for the Fourth of July events at Amanda's Field. Lastly he thanked

Roy Shone, Supervisor of Public Works, for placing temporary no parking signs along Old Tuckahoe Road. Later in the meeting Mr. Young requested a resolution be placed on the next agenda to authorize the engineer to solicit bids for field lighting at Amanda's Field baseball complex.

Anthony Inserra, Committeeman, reported on the maintenance of recreation fields and facilities. Lastly he briefly reported on the progress of trash collection with the automated trash trucks.

Edward Barr, Committeeman, reported that he recently had a very positive meeting with Dennis Township Officials with regard to the shared services for Municipal Court. He next reported that he will be attending a meeting with Committeeman Young and the Chief's Association to discuss public safety and security measures for the events on July 4th.

Richard Palombo, Mayor, also stated that the meeting with the officials from Dennis Township went very well. He next reported on an incident with a digital message sign on Route 49 which had been vandalized with an offensive message. While this incident was a mild practical joke, Mayor Palombo requested that any digital signs in the Township have proper security to avoid such a situation in the future.

OTHER REPORTS

Daniel Young, Municipal Attorney, briefly reported on his findings regarding term limits for Municipal Office. Mr. Young stated that it his opinion, based on case law, the Township Committee does not have the authority to institute term limits. He next reported that there are a number of items for closed session, personnel, contract negotiation items, and litigation.

Paul Dietrich, Municipal Engineer, gave a brief update on the Ocean Avenue paving project. The paving started last week and barring any inclement weather the project should be completed by the end of this week. Mayor Palombo inquired into the status of the beach erosion on the north end of Strathmere where there is a potentially hazardous situation. Mr. Dietrich stated that they are continuing to monitor the area, and given that we are entering into the summer months when the tides are more favorable and the threat of a major storm is low, the area is satisfactory at this time. However, as a contingency, Mr. Dietrich has contacted the contractor which performed the Township's previous emergency beach fills and obtained a preliminary price and a timeline in the event of an emergency situation. For the time being the signage closing the beach access path to that area will remain.

WHEREAS, Cape May County is pursuing a restoration project to restore the existing revetment wall along the east side of Ocean Drive (County Road 619) between the Rush Chattin Bridge and the Corsons Inlet Bridge and extend it approximately 400 feet southward from its existing terminus; and

WHEREAS, Cape May County is preparing to submit the final authorization package to NJDOT; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Upper wishes to support the County of Cape May in their efforts to attain authorization for this restoration project.
