### <u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u> - May 11, 2015 Regular Meeting and Closed Session Minutes

Motion by John Coggins, second by Edward Barr, to approve the May 11, 2015 Regular Meeting and Closed Session Minutes as submitted. During roll call vote all Committee members present voted in the affirmative.

#### REPORT OF GOVERNING BODY MEMBERS

**John Coggins, Committeeman,** reported that he has received numerous complaints from residents near the staging area of the pipeline project on Route 50. Paul Dietrich was directed to set up a meeting with the contractors to go over the issues. It was stated that assistance from the County Engineer be requested as well.

**Edward Barr, Committeeman,** reported that Public Works has been busy with brush collection and repairing the winter damaged roads. He next reported that a few Strathmere residents have expressed their concerns regarding a jitney service operating in Strathmere. Municipal Attorney stated that it is a private operation started by some of the local businesses in the area. It was suggested that a meeting of the parties be arranged to alleviate any concerns.

Jeffrey Pierson, Committeeman, reported that he attended and enjoyed the excellent Memorial Day Service at Osprey Point. He next stated that a Security Meeting will be held on June 1, 2015 at 3:30 in the conference room. He also reported that the Rescue Squad will be holding a fundraising event at the Tuckahoe Inn on May 30<sup>th</sup> from 2:00 pm to 6:00 pm. He next thanked Ted Kingston for his photos of the beach fill project. Lastly, he reported that for the past few years, the Fire Commissioners have had significant problems obtaining State certification of their funds. The Township releases the tax funds collected for the Fire Districts in one lump sum after the State Certification is granted. Committeeman Pierson made a motion, second by John Coggins, authorizing the Township to release half of the tax money collected for the fire districts now, with the second half to be released in August. Commencing in 2016 quarterly payments will be made in March and May, and the final half payment will be made in August. During roll call vote all four Committee members present voted in the affirmative.

**Richard Palombo, Mayor,** reported that the lifeguards are currently on alert status and will be manning the stands beginning June 6, 2015.

#### **OTHER REPORTS**

Daniel Young, Municipal Attorney, reported that there a few items for closed session.

**Paul Dietrich, Municipal Engineer,** reported that the Meghan Lane Developer has completed the final surface paving in the development. He requested a resolution accepting a two year maintenance bond from the developer. A resolution for formal action will be placed on the next agenda. Mr. Dietrich next gave a brief update on the beach fill project. The dredge is currently having some mechanical problems and will be delayed until it can be repaired. Work will continue on the crossovers and the dune fence in the meantime. Lastly, Mr. Dietrich requested authority to join the US Communities Co-op for various upcoming building projects. Motion by Edward Barr, second by John Coggins, to join the coop. During roll call vote all four Committee members present voted in the affirmative.

WHEREAS, the County of Camden on behalf of the South Jersey Power Cooperative ("SJPC") publicly advertised bids for the purpose of procuring electric energy services; and

WHEREAS, Cape May County is currently a member of the SJPC with Camden County as Lead Agency for the purchase of electric generation supply services for Cape May County and its Cooperative members; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township of Upper has been a member and wishes to continue its participation with the Cape May County Cooperative; and

WHEREAS, Camden County awarded a 24-month contract to

Constellation/New Energy of 1221 Lamar St. Suite 750 Houston, TX 77010, to provide electric

generation supply services at the rate of \$0.07367 per kilowatt-hour for facilities -- these being the lowest of three bids received; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township of Upper, as a participant of the SJPC, wishes to obtain electric services from Constellation/New Energy.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of Upper, Cape May County, that the Township hereby authorizes participation in the Cape May County Cooperative and the SJPC with Camden County as the Lead Agency; and
