<u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u> - December 15, 2014 Regular Meeting and Closed Session Minutes

Motion by Edward Barr, second by Hobie Young, to approve the December 15, 2014 Regular Meeting and Closed Session Minutes as submitted. During roll call vote four Committee members voted in the affirmative. Committeeman Pierson abstained.

REPORT OF GOVERNING BODY MEMBERS

John Coggins, Committeeman, requested that a budget workshop meeting be scheduled. After a brief discussion it was decided to schedule a special budget workshop meeting on February 2, 2015 at 6:30 pm. Notice of the meeting will be advertised. He next reported on a request from the American Legion to lease the Old Township Hall property. It was stated that a representative will contact the Committeeman in charge of Buildings and Grounds, Hobie Young, to go over the request. Committeeman Young will then report back to the Committee. It was also suggested to talk with Jay Potter regarding any safety issues with the property. Lastly, Mr. Coggins reported that a resident has contacted him with a concern regarding a tattoo parlor opening up on Route 9 in the downtown Marmora area. It was stated that tattoo parlors have been permitted previously and under the Ordinance at that time it was a permitted use. A determination initially whether or not it requires Board approval would need to made by the Zoning and Construction Official. In the event it is found to be a permitted use and does not require a change of use then they would be permitted to open without going before the board.

Hobie Young, Committeeman, reported that he will be holding a meeting regarding the special events for 2015. He stated that he hopes to form an advisory committee for the events. He then reported that the Recreation Advisory Board will soon hold their first meeting of the year. Later in the meeting, Mr. Young requested the procedure for a Committeeman lending his professional expertise to a project involving a public building. The municipal attorney advised that for a larger project there may be a conflict. In the past Committee members have given advice to the public works department on a particular project if it happens to fall in their line of expertise.

Edward Barr, Committeeman, reported that he recently met with the Supervisors of the Public Works Department to go over plans for projects, equipment, and personnel in 2015.

Jeffrey Pierson, Committeeman, reported that the Township will be holding a free rabies clinic on January 17 from 1-3 pm at Shore Veterinarians on Hope Corson Road. A second rabies clinic will be held on February 28 as well. He next reported on a several safety concerns raised by residents regarding the speed limit on a portion of Route 9 from Roosevelt Boulevard to the Beesley's Point Bridge, and on Old Tuckahoe Road. The Municipal Attorney was directed to confer with the Township Engineer and reach out to County and State Officials regarding the issues.

Richard Palombo, Mayor, reported on a recent meeting with the DEP. He stated that the DEP is willing to sign off that it appears that there is not going to be a nesting habitat and they are willing to talk to the Army Corps about taking that into consideration when they move forward with the project. A meeting to discuss the beach fill project is scheduled for next week with the Army Corps the DEP and representatives from the effected towns.

OTHER REPORTS

Barbara Young, Municipal Clerk, reported that Township offices will be closed on Monday January 19th in observance of Martin Luther King Jr.'s Birthday.

Daniel Young, Municipal Attorney, reported that there are a number of contract negotiation and personnel items for closed session.

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Township of Upper to treat the public, employees, prospective employees, appointees, volunteers and contractors in a manner consistent with all applicable civil rights laws and regulations including, but not limited to the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964 as subsequently amended, the New Jersey Law against

Discrimination, the Americans with Disabilities Act and the Conscientious Employee Protection Act, and

WHEREAS, the governing body of the of the Township of Upper has determined that certain procedures need to be established to accomplish this policy; and NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED to affirm and adopt the Township of Upper's civil rights policy as follows:

Section 1: No official, employee, appointee or volunteer of the Township of Upper by whatever title known, or any entity that is in any way a part of the Township of Upper shall engage, either directly or indirectly in any act including the failure to act that constitutes discrimination, harassment or a violation of any person's constitutional rights while such official, employee, appointee volunteer, or entity is engaged in or acting on behalf of the Township of Upper's business or using the facilities or property of the Township of Upper.

Section 2: The prohibitions and requirements of this resolution shall extend to any person or entity, including but not limited to any volunteer organization or inter-local organization, whether structured as a governmental entity or a private entity, that receives authorization or support in any way from the Township of Upper to provide services that otherwise could be performed by the Township of Upper.

Section 3: Discrimination, harassment and civil rights shall be defined for purposes of this resolution using the latest definitions contained in the applicable Federal and State laws concerning discrimination, harassment and civil rights.

Section 4: The Township Committee shall establish written procedures for any person to report alleged discrimination, harassment and violations of civil rights prohibited by this resolution. Such procedures shall include alternate ways to report a complaint so that the person making the complaint need not communicate with the alleged violator in the event the alleged violator would be the normal contact for such complaints.

Section 5: No person shall retaliate against any person who reports any alleged discrimination, harassment or violation of civil rights, provided however, that any person who reports alleged violations in bad faith shall be subject to appropriate discipline.

Section 6: The Personnel Officer shall establish written procedures that require all officials, employees, appointees and volunteers of the Township of Upper as well as all other entities subject to this resolution to periodically complete training concerning their duties, responsibilities and rights pursuant to this resolution.

Section 7: The Personnel Officer shall establish a system to monitor compliance and

shall report at least annually to the governing body the results of the monitoring.

Section 8: At least annually, the Municipal Clerk shall cause a summary of this resolution and the procedures established pursuant to this resolution to be communicated within the Township of Upper. This communication shall include a statement from the governing body expressing its unequivocal commitment to enforce this resolution. This summary shall also be posted on the Township of Upper's web site.

Section 9: This resolution shall take effect immediately.

Section 10: A copy of this resolution shall be published in the official newspaper of the Township of Upper in order for the public to be made aware of this policy and the Township of Upper's commitment to the implementation and enforcement of this policy.
