<u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u> - May 23, 2016 Regular Meeting and Closed Session Minutes

Motion by Hobie Young, second by Jeffrey Pierson, to approve the May 23, 2016 Regular Meeting and Closed Session Minutes as submitted. During roll call vote all five Committeemen voted in the affirmative.

REPORT OF GOVERNING BODY MEMBERS

John Coggins, Committeeman, reported that the approval to purchase a beach rescue vehicle and a trailer from the 2016 Capital Improvement Bond is listed on tonight's agenda. He praised Mr. Potter for saving the Township \$5,000.00 on the beach rescue vehicle by finding a demonstration model for sale.

Hobie Young, Committeeman, congratulated and thanked Committeeman Coggins, thanked all of the voters for their support, and wished Committeeman Barr a Happy Birthday. He then gave a brief update on the plans for the 4th of July event. He next requested a resolution honoring two members of the Upper Township Wrestling team for their performance at the MAWA competition. Lastly, he thanked the members of the Public Works Department for their cleanup efforts at the Strathmere playground.

Edward Barr, Committeeman, congratulated Committeemen Young and Coggins for their victory in the primary election. He next inquired if Public Works would be picking up trees and debris from the recent storm. Mr. Dietrich reported that residents should call the Public Works Department to report any downed trees.

Jeffrey Pierson, Committeeman, wished Committeeman Barr a Happy Birthday and offered his congratulations to Committeemen Young and Coggins. He next reported that he recently attended a final security meeting for the 4th of July event and all plans are ready and in place. He then reported that an emergency drill was held at the Municipal Building and the employees performed very well. Lastly, he reported that members of the Committee recently attended a meeting with the several state officials regarding the Rt 50 Bridge project. He requested that residents be mindful of the redirected traffic pattern for Rt 50 during weekends this summer.

Richard Palombo, Mayor, also offered his congratulations to Committeemen Young and Barr. He then reported that during the Memorial Day Services the Committee was presented with a commemorative coin for the 200th Anniversary of the American Legion in Upper Township. He then reported that the next Committee Meeting has been rescheduled to June 20th. Next he reminded everyone that in addition to the Township's 4th of July event at Amanda's Field, there will be a parade in Strathmere on the morning of July 4th at 10:30 am. Lastly he reported that the Farmer's Market will begin again this Friday June 17th at 3:30 pm.

OTHER REPORTS

Barbara Young, Municipal Clerk, congratulated Committeeman Young and Committeeman Coggins for their recent victory in the primary election.

Daniel Young, Municipal Attorney, offered his congratulations to Committeemen Young and Coggins as well. He next reported that the Special Events subcommittee has proposed offering different levels of sponsorship for the upcoming 4th of July event. They have also proposed having a donation box available at the entrance to the event. He requested that the Committee give their formal authorization for the proposed sponsorship levels and donation box. Motion by John Coggins, second by Edward Barr, to approve the requests. During roll call vote all five Committeemen voted in the affirmative. Mr. Young next reported that there are a few contract negotiation, personnel, and safety and security matters for closed session.

Paul Dietrich, Municipal Engineer, gave an update on the Township's Affordable Housing Market to Affordable Program. The Township has taken possession of a market to affordable house and an interested applicant has been interviewed. The applicant has been prequalified for a mortgage, however they do need assistance for the down payment. ORDINANCE NO. 011-2016

RE: AMENDING REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCE CHAPTERS XIX (LAND SUBDIVISION, SITE PLAN AND LAND USE ADMINISTRATION) AND XX (ZONING) OF THE CODE OF UPPER TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS, the Township Committee desires to amend land subdivision, site plan, land use administration and zoning; and

WHEREAS, Township Committee and the Upper Township Planning Board have identified elements in the Land Subdivision, Site Plan and Land Use Administration and Zoning ordinance that need modification, including clarification of zoning districts requiring sidewalks, penalty for violation of site plan provisions and existing non-confirming lot criteria; and

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee, in the Township of Upper, County of Cape May and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 19 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Upper, also known as the Code of Upper Township, shall be amended and supplemented as hereinafter provided:

19-7.4 Sidewalks.

Replace in its entirety Section 19-7.4a:

a. Sidewalks shall be provided in the following zones as designated in the Upper Township Zoning Ordinance:*

RR Resort Residential

RC Resort Commercial

TC Town Center

TCC Town Center Core

TV Tuckahoe Village

19-10 PENALTY.

25

10.1 Transfer or Sale of Land Prior to Final Approval.

a. If, before final subdivision approval has been granted, any party transfers or sells or agrees to transfer or sell, except pursuant to an agreement expressly conditioned on final subdivision approval as owner or agent, any land which forms a part of a subdivision for which municipal approval is required by ordinance pursuant to this act, then such person shall be subject to a penalty as described below.

b. Civil Action Instituted by Township.

In addition to the foregoing, the Municipality may institute and maintain a civil action:

- (1). For injunctive relief.
- (2). To set aside and invalidate any conveyance made pursuant to such a contract or sale if a certificate of compliance has not been issued in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40:55D-56.

c. Entitlement to Lien.

In any such action, the transferee, purchaser or grantee shall be entitled to a lien upon the portion of the land from which the subdivision was made that remains in the possession of the subdivider or his assigns or successors to secure the return of any deposit made or purchase price paid and also a reasonable search fee, survey expense and title closing expense, if any. Any such action must be brought within two (2) years after the date of the recording of the instrument or transfer, sale or conveyance of said land or within six (6) years, if unrecorded.

10.2 Site Plan Approval.

- a. If, before site plan approval has been granted any party clears any trees or underbrush from a lot, or changes any use on a property, or begins construction of any storage yard, building, structure or addition thereto, then such person shall be subject to a penalty as described below.
- b. Property owner shall be responsible for maintaining all improvements as shown on the approved final site plan approval and contained in the approving resolution. Any such person violating this section shall be subject to a penalty as described below.

10.3 Penalty

Any person(s) who is found to be in violation of the provisions of this Chapter shall be subject to a fine in the minimum amount of five hundred (\$500.00) dollars and not to exceed one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars for each day. Except as otherwise provided, each and every day in which a violation of any provision of this Code or any other ordinance of the Township exists shall constitute a separate violation.

SECTION 2. Chapter 20 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Upper, also known as the Code of Upper Township, shall be amended and supplemented as hereinafter provided:

Section 20-5.6g2(a) Nonconforming Uses, Structures and Lots.

Replace in its entirety Section 20-5.6g2(a):

- g. Any lots situated in the "AR," "C," "RR," "R," "R2," "TV," "TR," "PV," "RD," "F3," "F10," or "F25" Districts which:
 - 1. No change.
 - 2. Has a minimum frontage and width of one hundred (100') feet and a minimum area of thirty thousand (30,000) square feet; or has a minimum frontage of one hundred twenty (120') feet and a minimum area of twenty thousand (20,000) square feet; or is a developed residential lot that has an existing legally occupied structure; may have a construction permit issued for use permitted in the zoning district provided each of the following conditions are met:
 - (a) Such a lot shall have been created by a subdivision plat or deed duly recorded in the Office of the Cape May County Clerk on or before August 31, 1986 or if situated in the "AR" District on or before October 9, 2007, which plat or deed shall clearly designate the lot as an individual parcel of land having either a minimum frontage and width of one hundred (100') feet and a minimum area of thirty thousand (30,000) square feet or a minimum frontage and width of one hundred twenty (120') feet and a minimum area of twenty thousand (20,000) square feet; or is an existing developed lot; and

SECTION 3: EFFECTIVE DATE: This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption and publication as required by law.

SECTION 4: REPEALER: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency only.

SECTION 5: SEVERABILITY: If any section, paragraph, subdivision, subsection, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, subsection, clause or provision declared invalid and the remainder of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect and shall be enforceable.

SECTION 6: CODIFICATION: This Ordinance shall be codified as indicated in Chapters 19 and 20 of the Upper Township Code.
