Motion by Jeffrey Pierson, second by John Coggins, to introduce Ordinance 006-2016 with the public hearing and final adoption scheduled for April 25, 2016. During roll call vote all five Committeemen voted in the affirmative.

## TOWNSHIP OF UPPER CALENDAR YEAR 2016 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14)

## ORDINANCE NO. <u>006-2016</u>

**WHEREAS**, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S.40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of it annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 0% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous' year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

**WHEREAS,** N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between that amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Township Committee of the Township of Upper in the County of Cape May finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2016 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Township Committee hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$346,270.75 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Township Committee hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

**NOW THERETOFORE BE IT ORDAINED,** by the Township Committee of the Township of Upper, in the County of Cape May, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2016 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Upper shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J. S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5% amounting to \$346,270.75 and that the CY 2016 municipal budget for the Township of Upper be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced by filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days of such adoption.

**Barbara Young, Municipal Clerk**, reminded everyone that the Township offices will be closed on March 25<sup>th</sup> for the Good Friday holiday.

**Daniel Young, Municipal Attorney**, reported that there are a number of items for closed session.

**Paul Dietrich, Municipal Engineer**, reported that the DEP is providing towns with seedlings to replace trees that were lost during Super Storm Sandy. He and the Green Team will be distributing the seedlings to interested residents on Saturday April 9<sup>th</sup> from 12:30 pm to 2:00 pm at Amanda's Field. Mr. Dietrich next reported that the President has given a Federal Declaration for Winter Storm Jonas. He will be working with the OEM office to determine what storm preparation, response, and public cleanup assistance will be eligible for reimbursement. Information to homeowners who were affected by the storm will be given out when available. Mr. Dietrich next requested authorization to notify the County of the Township's intent to participate in the County's Hazard Mitigation Grant program which will apply for funding to elevate or acquire severe and repetitive loss properties. Motion by Jeffrey Pierson, second by Edward Barr, to approve the request. During roll call vote all four Committeemen present voted in the affirmative. Lastly, he reported that the Public Works Department has been doing some spring cleaning in Strathmere and will continue on to the Beesley's Point beach and boat ramp to prepare for the summer season.

**Barbara Spiegel, Chief Financial Officer**, reported on a request from the Deputy Court Administrator to attend a three day conference in Cape May. **WHEREAS,** the increasing homeless population in Cape May County deserves access to a better life through counseling and training.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Upper, in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey, as follows:

WHEREAS, the Township has received an offer from John James Germanio, President of Belleplain Land, Inc. to exchange certain lands; and

WHEREAS, after discussion and deliberation, the Township Committee is of the opinion that the exchange will be in the best interest of the Township as it will eliminate isolated parcels and will permit the Township, as well as a private party, to aggregate land providing for larger parcels; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Township Committee in the Township of Upper, County of Cape May and State of New Jersey as follows:

**SECTION 1**: Subject to the provisions hereafter set forth, the Township of Upper is authorized to exchange certain lands owned by it with lands owned by Belleplain Land, Inc. more particularly described as follows:

- (A) The Township of Upper shall convey to Belleplain Land, Inc.Block 332, Lots 18, 19, and 20; and Block 333, Lots 23 and 24.
- (B) Belleplain Land, Inc. shall convey to the Township Block 354, Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5.

**SECTION 2**: The Upper Township Tax Assessor and independent appraisals prepared by Louis A. Bonato dated December 14, 2015 have determined the full and fair market value of the land pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12-16 and the value of the municipal land to be exchanged does not exceed the value of the land to be received by the municipality. The exchange shall be an even exchange with no additional cash consideration from either party.

**SECTION 3**: The exchange of lands authorized in Section 1 hereof is expressly conditioned and contingent upon the following:

(A) The parties shall execute an agreement detailing the specifics of the entire

transaction. Said agreement shall contain the terms and provisions of this Ordinance and such other terms and conditions as the Township deems appropriate to effectuate the purposes of this Ordinance.

- (B) Title reports shall be prepared by a title abstracting company and title underwriter acceptable to the Township and Belleplain Land, Inc. The title reports must, at a minimum, provide evidence that the property to be exchanged is owned, in fee simple, by the parties who shall be conveying same, that title is marketable and insurable at regular rates and that there are no liens, encumbrances or conditions, reservations or restrictions of record which would interfere with the intended use of the property by the Grantees.
- (C) The agreement between the parties shall expressly provide that the exchange of lands and all contingencies and conditions contained in said agreement are inter-dependent and one shall not occur without the other. To that end, the parties agree that the exchange shall occur simultaneously.
- (D) Any property to be conveyed herein shall be conveyed by Bargain and Sale Deed. The Township of Upper shall pay for the cost of the title report and all title company settlement charges for the land to be received by the Township and Belleplain Land, Inc. shall pay the cost of the title report and all title company settlement charges for the land to be received by Belleplain Land, Inc. Each party shall bear the cost of preparation of the deed conveying the property to the other. Each party shall be solely responsible for the cost of title insurance covering the parcels received by such party as a result of the exchange of lands.
- (E) With respect to the property being conveyed by the Township, conveyance

is under and subject to any riparian claim which may affect said property. In addition, the Township makes no representation as to the ability of the property to obtain a building permit or any other governmental approval. Belleplain Land, Inc. is required to comply with all applicable zoning, building and health ordinances, codes and regulations. The property to be transferred by the Township may be situated in a flood hazard zone. The Township of Upper makes no warranties or representations, expressed or implied, as to the property being transferred, the condition or marketability of title or any other matter. The Township of Upper makes no warranties or representations, expressed or implied, as to whether or not the property being transferred contains wetlands anywhere on the property. The Township of Upper makes no warranties or representations, expressed or implied, as to any matter of an environmental nature, or otherwise, which may prevent or limit building or construction or use of the property.

(F) In the event a defect in the title or physical condition of the land to be received by the Township is discovered prior to closing, the Township may cancel this exchange whereupon there shall be no further obligations between the parties.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF UPPER, IN

THE COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof

affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

The several improvements described in Section 3 of this bond Section 1. ordinance are hereby respectively authorized to be undertaken by the Township of Upper, in the County of Cape May, New Jersey (the "Township") as general improvements. For the several improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there are hereby appropriated the respective sums of money therein stated as the appropriation made for each improvement or purpose, such sums amounting in the aggregate to \$2,970,300, and further including the aggregate sum of \$148,515 as the several down payments for the improvements or purposes required by the Local Bond Law. The down payments have been made available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in one or more previously adopted budgets.

In order to finance the cost of the several improvements or purposes Section 2. not covered by application of the several down payments, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$2,821,785 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

The excess of the appropriation made for each of the improvements or purposes aforesaid over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor, as above stated, is the amount of the down payment for each purpose.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no bond anticipation note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of the Local Bond Law. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The Township hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are all improvements or purposes that the Township may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.

(b) The average period of usefulness, computed on the basis of the respective amounts of obligations authorized for each purpose and the reasonable life thereof within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, is 8.95 years.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$2,821,785, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$300,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purposes or improvements.

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Section 7. The Township hereby declares the intent of the Township to issue bonds or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance and to use the proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes or improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance. This Section 7 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of Treasury Regulations.

Section 8. Any grant moneys received for the purposes or improvements described in Section 3 hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 9. The chief financial officer of the Township is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Township and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Township. The chief financial officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Township pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Township and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Township fails to comply with its undertaking, the Township shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

Section 10. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this

bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and

the Township shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property

within the Township for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without

limitation of rate or amount.

Section 11. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

- A. It is anticipated that the matters discussed in closed session may be disclosed to the public upon the determination of the Township Committee that the public interest will no longer be served by such confidentiality.
- B. With respect to contract negotiations such matters will be made public when negotiations have ceased and there is no longer a reason for confidentiality.
- C. With respect to employment and personnel matters such discussions will be made public if and when formal action is taken or when the individuals involved consent that it can be made public.
- D. With respect to litigation matters such discussions will be made public when litigation is complete and the applicable appeal period has expired.
