#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES -

December 14, 2015 Regular Meeting and Closed Session Minutes

Motion by Jeff Pierson, second by John Coggins, to approve the December 14, 2015 Regular Meeting and Closed Session Minutes as submitted. During roll call vote all five Committeemen voted in the affirmative.

#### **REPORT OF GOVERNING BODY MEMBERS**

**John Coggins, Committeeman,** reported that the 2016 budget process has begun, and Committee members should have the first budget draft by next week. He requested a budget workshop be held before the next meeting on January 25<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm. Last, he commended all of the departments for coming in under budget in 2015.

**Hobie Young, Committeeman,** reported that the individual suspected of vandalism at Amanda's Field will be brought before the court soon. He requested that someone from the Township be in attendance to represent the Township's interests. The Municipal Engineer stated that he will make sure someone is in attendance. Committeeman Young next brought up an issue regarding the condition of the Community Center during the busy winter weekends. He recommended that a part-time employee be hired to make sure the building is cleaned throughout the day and locked and secured after the events. After a lengthy discussion it was suggested that until the best plan of action is determined, overtime hours be offered to current employees to make sure the building is cleaned and secured over the weekends. **Jeffrey Pierson, Committeeman,** reported that the free rabies clinic was a success this past Saturday. The next one will be held on February 6, 2016 from 1:00 to 3:00 at Shore Veterinarians.

**Edward Barr, Committeeman,** reported that the first round of leaf collection went very well, and the second round is almost complete, along with the Christmas tree collection. He also stated that the Township's supply of salt should be adequate for the season.

## **OTHER REPORTS**

**Daniel Young, Municipal Attorney**, reported that there are a number of litigation, contract negotiation, personnel, and safety and security items for closed session.

**Paul Dietrich, Municipal Engineer,** gave a brief update on the Route 50 Tuckahoe Bridge project, the Strathmere beach replenishment project, and the Garden State Parkway Bridge project. Last he requested authority to place an ordinance on an agenda which will establish the accessory apartment project as part of the Township's affordable housing fair share plan. A sample Ordinance has already been prepared and reviewed by the Committee a number of years ago. The Municipal Attorney stated that any further details on the project should be discussed during tonight's closed session under litigation – affordable housing.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 26-2016**

RE: AFFIRMING THE TOWNSHIP OF UPPER'S CIVIL RIGHTS POLICY WITH RESPECT TO ALL OFFICIALS, APPOINTEES, EMPLOYEES, PROSPECTIVE EMPLOYEES, VOLUNTEERS, INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS, AND MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC THAT COME INTO CONTACT WITH MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES, WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Township of Upper to treat the public, employees, prospective employees, appointees, volunteers and contractors in a manner consistent with all applicable civil rights laws and regulations including, but not limited to the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964 as subsequently amended, the New Jersey Law against Discrimination, the Americans with Disabilities Act and the Conscientious Employee Protection Act, and

**WHEREAS**, the governing body of the of the Township of Upper has determined that certain procedures need to be established to accomplish this policy; and

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** to affirm and adopt the Township of Upper's civil rights policy as follows:

Section 1: No official, employee, appointee or volunteer of the Township of Upper by whatever title known, or any entity that is in any way a part of the Township of Upper shall engage, either directly or indirectly in any act including the failure to act that constitutes discrimination, harassment or a violation of any person's constitutional rights while such official, employee, appointee volunteer, or entity is engaged in or acting on behalf of the Township of Upper's business or using the facilities or property of the Township of Upper.

**Section 2:** The prohibitions and requirements of this resolution shall extend to any person or entity, including but not limited to any volunteer organization or inter-local organization, whether structured as a governmental entity or a private entity, that receives authorization or support in any way from the Township of Upper to provide services that otherwise could be performed by the Township of Upper.

Section 3: Discrimination, harassment and civil rights shall be defined for purposes of this resolution using the latest definitions contained in the applicable Federal and State laws concerning discrimination, harassment and civil rights.

Section 4: The Township Committee shall establish written procedures for any person to report alleged discrimination, harassment and violations of civil rights prohibited by this resolution. Such procedures shall include alternate ways to report a complaint so that the person making the complaint need not communicate with the alleged violator in the event the alleged violator would be the normal contact for such complaints.

Section 5: No person shall retaliate against any person who reports any alleged discrimination, harassment or violation of civil rights, provided however, that any person who reports alleged violations in bad faith shall be subject to appropriate discipline.

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**Section 6:** The Personnel Officer shall establish written procedures that require all officials, employees, appointees and volunteers of the Township of Upper as well as all other entities subject to this resolution to periodically complete training concerning their duties, responsibilities and rights pursuant to this resolution.

**Section 7:** The Personnel Officer shall establish a system to monitor compliance and shall report at least annually to the governing body the results of the monitoring.

**Section 8:** At least annually, the Municipal Clerk shall cause a summary of this resolution and the procedures established pursuant to this resolution to be communicated within the Township of Upper. This communication shall include a statement from the governing body expressing its unequivocal commitment to enforce this resolution. This summary shall also be posted on the Township of Upper's web site.

Section 9: This resolution shall take effect immediately.

**Section 10:** A copy of this resolution shall be published in the official newspaper of the Township of Upper in order for the public to be made aware of this policy and the Township of Upper's commitment to the implementation and enforcement of this policy.

(D) The services are such that their relative work must be judged by

subjective considerations that are not susceptible of valuation by competitive bidding; and

(E) The individual who will provide these services has demonstrated his

competence and particular expertise in the services required.
