*****BUDGET WORKSHOP MEETING - 6:30 P.M.

In preparation of the 2016 Municipal Budget a budget workshop meeting was called to order this evening at 6:30 PM.

Mayor Palombo read the Open Public meeting notice into the record.

Also present were Municipal Clerk Barbara Young, Finance Officer Barbara Spiegel, and Municipal Engineer Paul Dietrich.

Committeeman John Coggins stated that tonight he would like to talk broadly about the overall budget and discuss what the proposed budget, as it stands now, would mean for the Township as well as the affect it may have on the taxpayers. He stated that he would also like to discuss the different options that are available to the Committee.

Committeeman Coggins stated that the proposed budget for salary and operating expenses has increased approximately \$498,000.00 from last year, which would mean a .02 cent tax increase to the local purpose tax. He stated that \$358,000.00 would need to be reduced from the proposed operating expenses to achieve a tax neutral budget. He encouraged all departments to figure out 1% of their proposed budget and try to reduce their department's operating expense line item by that amount.

There followed a brief overview and discussion of each department's capital requests, and then a lengthy discussion regarding the funds available in the current bond and the possibility of adopting a new bond ordinance. It was requested that the Departments submit a new list of requested capital expenditures that have been itemized by priority over 10 years.

A second budget workshop meeting was then scheduled for Monday February 8, 2016 at 6:30 p.m. to continue the discussion. Motion by John Coggins, second by Jeff Pierson, to adjourn the budget workshop. During roll call vote all five Committee members voted in the affirmative

There was a brief recess and then the regular meeting convened.

Motion by Jeff Pierson, second by Edward Barr, to approve the January 6, 2016 Reorganization Minutes and January 11, 2016 Regular Meeting and Closed Session Minutes as submitted. During roll call vote all five Committeemen voted in the affirmative.

REPORT OF GOVERNING BODY MEMBERS

John Coggins, Committeeman, thanked everyone for their participation in the budget workshop meeting tonight, and also congratulated the Public Works Department for the outstanding job they did with the snow removal and storm related issues over the past weekend.

Hobie Young, Committeeman, also thanked the Department of Public Works and stated that he has heard nothing but compliments on the job they did with the storm. He next reported that someone has trespassed into Amanda's Field again and caused some damage to the football and soccer field. He requested that the access point at Sunset Road be gated off and kept closed. Next he stated that a crew has done a nice job of cleaning up the dead trees and brush from Caldwell Park. He next reported that they will be scheduling a meeting soon to discuss the next Spring/Easter event. Later in the meeting he requested that no smoking signs be placed in all the parks and tot lots throughout the Township. The Municipal Attorney stated that Township Code does prohibit smoking in those areas. The Committee directed that signs be placed near the playgrounds and tot lots designating the area as no smoking.

Edward Barr, Committeeman, offered kudos to the Public Works Department, the OEM Office, the EMS Department, Fire Companies, and the State Police for the great work they did over the weekend with the storm. He stated that he believes the message has gotten out to the public with regard to removing vehicles from the side of the road during snow storms. He stated that it makes the plower's job so much easier when the roads are clear of vehicles.

Jeffrey Pierson, Committeeman, also congratulated the first responders and Public Works Department for their excellent storm response. He next reported that 128 animals were vaccinated during the January Rabies Clinic. A second Rabies Clinic will be held on

February 6th from 1:00 to 3:00 at Shore Vets. Lastly, he reported that the Rescue Squad will be selling roses on February 13th and 14th from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm.

Richard Palombo, Mayor, stated that this past weekend's storm was a great way to assess the Township's emergency resources and personnel. There has been a lot of planning and equipment acquisitions over the years and they were both put to good use. He thanked Jay Potter and the rescue squad staff for manning the phones throughout the weekend, Mike Jones for his work through the OEM Office and Public Works, and Chris Thomas and the Public Works staff for the snow removal and debris cleanup.

OTHER REPORTS

Daniel Young, Municipal Attorney, reported that there are a few litigation items and a personnel item for closed session.

Paul Dietrich, Municipal Engineer, reported that he will be meeting with State OEM and FEMA Officials tomorrow morning to assess the damage from the recent storm. He next reported that there is a good likelihood that this week they will be implementing the new traffic changes and the alternating one way traffic signal for the Route 50 Tuckahoe Bridge project. An announcement of the traffic changes will be placed on UTTV.
