APPROVAL OF MINUTES - September 12, 2016 Closed Session B Minutes

Motion by Jeffrey Pierson, second by John Coggins, to approve the September 12, 2016 Closed Session B Minutes as submitted. During roll call vote all three Committeemen present voted in the affirmative.

REPORT OF GOVERNING BODY MEMBERS

Jeffrey Pierson, Committeeman, reported that 55 dogs and 34 cats were vaccinated at the free rabies clinic held this past Saturday. He next reported on a serious safety concern regarding emergency access to Harbor Road and Cove Road during the Parkway bridge project. Motion by Jeffrey Pierson, second by John Coggins, to draft a letter to State Officials requesting that the safety concerns be addressed expeditiously. During roll call vote all three Committeemen present voted in the affirmative. Lastly, Mr. Pierson reported that he has been in contact with Kevin Grubb regarding several issues with the use of fields. He stated that he informed Mr. Grubb that he would need to gather more information from Committeeman Barr and Committeeman Young in order to address his concerns.

Richard Palombo, Mayor, reminded everyone that the Fall Fest will be held on Saturday October 1st from 11:00 am to 3:00 pm at Amanda's Field, with a rain date scheduled for October 2nd.

OTHER REPORTS

Daniel Young, Municipal Attorney, reported that there are two changes to the closed session agenda. The personnel matter will not be discussed, and the contract negotiation item is now listed as EMS billing and collection contract proposals.

Paul Dietrich, Municipal Engineer, reported that he recently attended a meeting with the Historical Society of Upper Township regarding the proposed use of the former town hall building as a museum. He stated that after researching the various grants that may be available, it was determined that the Township can apply for a County Open Space recreational grant which, if awarded, will fully fund the project. The Historical Society will be preparing the grant application with Mr. Dietrich's help, and once complete it will be brought back before the Committee for their review and adoption of a resolution of support. There followed a brief discussion regarding the utility costs and ADA access of the building.

Barbara Spiegel, Chief Financial Officer, requested approval for employee William McDaniels to attend a three day Clean Communities certification class at a cost \$295.00. ORDINANCE NO. 012-2016

AN ORDINANCE VACATING A PORTION OF FIRST AVENUE, SOUTH OF BAYAIRE ROAD, WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF UPPER, COUNTY OF CAPE MAY AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40:67-1 authorizes the Governing Body of a municipality to adopt an Ordinance, among other things, to vacate any street, highway, lane, alley, square, place or park, or any part thereof, dedicated to public use but not accepted by the municipality, whether or not the same, or any portion, has been actually opened or improved; and

WHEREAS, Michael E. and Robin A. Halpern are the owners of Block 723, Lot 37 and have requested that the Township vacate a portion of First Avenue, south of Bayaire Road, as described in this Ordinance and have agreed to pay the costs incurred by the Township to vacate said street including the costs of the revisions to the tax map; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee has duly considered the matter and it appears reasonable to agree to the request since there is no present or foreseeable need or intention to utilize said roadway; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed to be in the public interest to vacate a portion of First Avenue within the Township of Upper, as hereinafter provided.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Upper, in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1: The public right in, along, upon and over the following described land is hereby vacated, surrendered and extinguished:

Description

Vacation of a portion of First Avenue, south of Bayaire Road, as shown on Tax Map Sheet No. 28 Marmora Section of Township of Upper

BEGINNING at the Southwesterly line of Bayaire Ave. (50' wide) and extending southerly abutting Block 723 Lots 37 and 43 to the southerly terminus at Block 723 Lot 37.

SECTION 2: This Ordinance vacates no portion of the street except that portion set forth and described in **SECTION 1** above.

SECTION 3: EXCEPTION: This Ordinance expressly reserves and excepts from vacation all rights and privileges now possessed by public utilities, as defined in R.S. 48:2-13, and by any cable television company, as defined in the "Cable Television Act", P.L. 1972, c. 186, (C.48:5A-1, et seq.), to maintain, repair and replace their existing facilities in, adjacent to, over or under the street, highway, lane, alley, square, place or park, or any part thereof, to be vacated, as hereinabove described.

SECTION 4: REPEALER: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances

inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency only.

SECTION 5: EFFECTIVE DATE: This Ordinance shall take effect

immediately upon final adoption and publication as required by law.

7. **Cape May County MUA Recycling Rebate for 2015**. Paul Dietrich reported that the Township's recycling rate for 2015 was 23.99% which allowed the Township to avoid \$171,012.35 in solid waste tipping fees. The County has acknowledged the Township's recycling efforts and recommends a recycling rate goal of 35% for 2016.

NEW BUSINESS

- 8. Ocean City High School Booster Club request to hold Raffle RA-464 at Yesterday's, 316 Roosevelt Boulevard, Marmora on December 9, 2016. Motion by Jeffrey Pierson, second by John Coggins, to approve the request. During roll call vote all three Committeemen present voted in the affirmative.
- 9. Greater Tuckahoe Area Merchants' Association request to hold Raffles RA-465 and RA-466 at the Upper Township Community Center on November 19, 2016. Motion by Jeffrey Pierson, second by John Coggins, to approve the request. During roll call vote all three Committeemen present voted in the affirmative.
- 10. Randall Roash request to vacate a portion of Otis Avenue in Strathmere. Paul Dietrich reported that a portion of Otis Avenue adjacent to Block 821, Lot 1 and a portion of Block 820, Lot 1 is needed for drainage. He stated that the remaining portion of Otis Avenue east to Landis Avenue has no public purpose and can be vacated. Motion by Jeffrey Pierson, second by John Coggins, to approve the request. During roll call vote all three Committeemen present voted in the affirmative. An Ordinance for formal action will be placed on the next agenda.
- 11. **Alternatives to the EpiPen auto-injector Division of EMS.** Chief E.M.T. Jay Potter requested the Committee's support for an alternative to the high cost EpiPen. After a brief discussion, there was a motion by Richard Palombo, seconded by Jeffrey Pierson, to support proposed legislation which would allow properly trained EMS

personnel to administer an approved alternative to the EpiPen auto-injector. During roll call vote all three Committeemen present voted in the affirmative.

- 12. **Bid Results for 2016 or newer Dump Truck.** Paul Dietrich reported that although eleven companies requested the specifications, only one bid was submitted. It was suggested that before the bid is accepted, Mr. Dietrich should inquire as to the reason why so many were unresponsive. Motion by Jeffrey Pierson, second by John Coggins, to table this matter to the next meeting. During roll call vote all three Committeemen present voted in the affirmative.
- 13. Nugent Enterprises, Inc. request for the Township to sign an Indemnity and Hold Harmless Agreement for the use of property at 11 Route US 9 South.

 Motion by Jeffrey Pierson, second by John Coggins, to approve the request. During roll call vote all three Committeemen present voted in the affirmative.

14. Authorization to sign Verizon Wireless Cell Tower Contract.
