November 7, 2016 Regular Meeting and Closed Session Minutes

Motion by Hobie Young, second by John Coggins, to approve the November 7, 2016 Regular Meeting and Closed Session Minutes as submitted. During roll call vote all four Committeemen voted in the affirmative.

### **REPORT OF GOVERNING BODY MEMBERS**

**John Coggins, Committeeman**, wished everyone a happy Thanksgiving and asked all to remember those that may be struggling financially during this holiday season.

**Hobie Young, Committeeman**, thanked Pete Buganski and the Department of Public Works for decorating Town Hall for the Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony. He next congratulated Ralph Cooper for receiving the Volunteer of the Year award from the Evening Rotary. He next reported that he recently met with the Historical Society and the plans to restore and convert the former Town Hall building into a museum are moving forward. Lastly, he reported that the Amanda's Field baseball fields are progressing and they are moving forward with consolidating all baseball to Amanda's Field and potentially moving Softball to Caldwell Park. **Edward Barr, Committeeman**, reported that the Township has begun collecting leaves, and asked residents to please check the website for the schedule. He next reported that trash and recycling collection for this Thursday will be picked up on Friday, and Friday's collection will be picked up on Monday. He next reported that the Tuckahoe Fire Company will be hosting Breakfast with Santa on December 4<sup>th</sup> from 7:00 to 11:00 am. A Toys for Tots collection box will be available at the breakfast. Lastly, he wished everyone a happy and safe Thanksgiving.

**Richard Palombo, Mayor**, thanked Mr. Eisele for generously donating the tree for the Christmas Tree Lighting ceremony. He also thanked Township Clerk Barbara Young for coordinating the event. He next made a motion to change the December 12<sup>th</sup> Committee meeting to December 19<sup>th</sup>. The motion was seconded by Edward Barr. During roll call vote all four Committeemen voted in the affirmative. Lastly, he reported that the Township will be applying to the NJDEP for outdoor recreation grants.

# **OTHER REPORTS**

**Barbara Young, Municipal Clerk**, reported that the Township Offices will be closed on Thursday and Friday November 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> for the Thanksgiving Holiday.

Daniel Young, Municipal Attorney, reported that there are a few items for closed session.

**Paul Dietrich, Municipal Engineer**, reported that the contractor for the Bayview Drive Boat Ramp project has requested a time extension to complete the remainder of project in the spring when temperatures will be more conducive to pouring concrete curb & sidewalk. After a lengthy discussion, there was a general consensus to deny the request for a time extension. Next, he reported that the Township has closed on the first Market to Affordable housing project. He next reported on proposed COAH legislation, S-2254 and A-3821, which re-affirms the language and legislative intent of the Fair Housing Act in order to progress toward a more rational statewide housing policy. He recommended that the Township adopt a resolution in support of the proposed legislation. The Committee directed that a resolution for formal action be placed on the next agenda. Lastly, Mr. Dietrich reported that the court has upheld New York City's appeal of FEMA's preliminary Flood Insurance Rate Maps. FEMA will now have to restudy the entire flood mapping area, which will take several years. FEMA will allow Municipalities to adopt the preliminary maps as long as all Municipalities in the County also approve. He recommended that the Township give a positive response towards adopting the preliminary flood maps.

# **TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE VACANCY**

WHEREAS, the Township of Upper, hereinafter referred to as MUNICIPALITY, is a participating member municipality of the Atlantic County Municipal

Joint Insurance Fund, hereinafter referred to as FUND; and

WHEREAS, the FUND is a statutory filed municipal joint insurance fund as

defined in N.J.A.C. 11:15-2.1 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the MUNICIPALITY joined the FUND knowing that membership

carries with it joint and several liability with all other member municipalities for each year of

the MUNICIPALITY's membership; and

**WHEREAS**, the MUNICIPALITY understands that the FUND's Executive Committee are the only persons authorized in law to make decisions as to when and how much of any available statutory surplus will be released by the FUND; and

WHEREAS, the MUNICIPALITY understands that the FUND's Executive Committee are the only persons authorized in law to make decisions as to when and how much of any projected deficit will be declared as an additional assessment due to the FUND; and

WHEREAS, the MUNICIPALITY understands that Available Statutory Surplus is defined to be the amount of money in excess of the projected value of claims by line of coverage, plus an actuarially determined value for Incurred But Not Reported claims, subject to the surplus reserve calculations as defined in N.J.A.C. 11:15-4.6 et seq., and subject to review and approval by the Department of Banking and Insurance and Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey, prior to release by the Executive Committee of the FUND; and

WHEREAS, the MUNICIPALITY understands that it remains jointly and severally liable into perpetuity despite the earlier release of Available Statutory Surplus due to the possibility that a FUND year wherein a return of Statutory Surplus has been duly authorized could later be presented with a claim for which it could be responsible causing a demand for an additional assessment from each participating member municipality of that FUND year; and

WHEREAS, the MUNICIPALITY understands that it remains jointly and severally liable into perpetuity despite the earlier collection of an additional assessment due to the possibility that a FUND year wherein an additional assessment has been duly authorized could later be presented with a need for additional assessments from each participating member municipality of that FUND year; and WHEREAS, the MUNICIPALITY understands that its options for directing the distribution of its net share of released Statutory Surplus to be as follows:

- 1. Direct the FUND to apply the MUNICIPALITY's share to the MUNICIPALITY's premium as credit in the next FUND fiscal year (N.J.A.C. 11:15-4.21(e)),
- 2. Direct the FUND to issue a check to the MUNICIPALITY for the MUNICIPALITY's share,
- 3. Direct the FUND to apply the MUNICIPALITY's share to the FUND's Aggregate Excess Loss Contingency Fund (A.E.L.C.F.), which provides member municipalities with an available individual contingency balance for use in satisfying any possible need for a supplemental assessment for any year they were a member and an annual capacity to use all or a portion of a member municipality's available balance in offsetting future premiums, **or**
- 4. Direct the FUND to apportion the MUNICIPALITY's share as a stated dollar amount among options 1, 2 and 3 above such that <u>the sum total of allocated dollars</u> <u>equals the amount of the Net Distribution available</u> to the MUNICIPALITY as noted above.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Upper, in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. The allegations of the preamble are incorporated herein by this reference.

2. The MUNICIPALITY does hereby direct the FUND to apply the MUNICIPALITY'S full dividend, in the amount of \$31,964.00, as a credit to the MUNICIPALITY'S 2017 JIF Assessment.

3. The MUNICIPALITY does hereby further direct the FUND to apply a portion of the MUNICIPALITY'S balance in the FUND'S Aggregate Excess Loss

Contingency Fund, in the amount of \$3,036.00, as a credit to the MUNICIPALITY'S 2017 JIF

Assessment.

take all action deemed necessary or advisable to carry into effect the intent and purpose of this

### RE: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCE CHAPTER II (ADMINISTRATION) OF THE CODE OF UPPER TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Upper, in order to provide for the orderly and efficient administration of Township business, has determined that it is appropriate to amend Chapter II (Administration) of the Code of Upper Township to create the office of Township Administrator and identify the various departments within the Township; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:9-136 the governing body of any municipality, by ordinance, may create the office of Township Administrator and delegate to such person all or a portion of the executive responsibilities of the municipality; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township Committee of the Township of Upper has determined to create the position of Township Administrator and delegate to such person a portion of the executive responsibilities of the Township.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Township Committee, in the Township of Upper, County of Cape May and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter II of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Upper, also known as the Code of Upper Township, shall be amended and supplemented as hereinafter provided:

Section 2-2.4 is hereby replaced in its entirety with the following:

### 2-2.4 Township Administrator.

a. **Creation of Position.** The office of Township Administrator is hereby created in and for the Township of Upper pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:9-36 et seq.

- b. **Appointment and Term.** The Township Administrator shall be appointed by the majority vote of the Township Committee and the term of office of the Township Administrator shall be at the pleasure of the Township Committee.
- c. Compensation. Compensation to perform the duties and responsibilities of Township Administrator shall be determined and established by the Township Committee according to law.
- d. **Qualifications.** The Township Administrator shall possess knowledge and experience in local government for the appointment as Township Administrator.
- e. **Powers and duties.** The Township Administrator, under the supervision and control of the Township Committee, and to the extent not prohibited by law, shall:
  - Be the chief executive and administrative official of the Township of Upper with respect to the following departments: Department of Public Works, Department of Public Safety, Department of Emergency Management, Department of Personnel and Division of Emergency Medical Services (EMS). The Township Administrator shall perform such duties in each department under the general supervision of the member of the Township Committee appointed by the Township Committee as the head of such department.
  - 2. Act as liaison between the Township Committee, the Township Committee department heads, all committees, officers and employees within each department over which the Township Administrator has supervision.
  - 3. Be responsible for the maintenance of sound personnel policies and administrative practice and to study and make recommendations in respect to personnel, hiring, organization and policies of the Township and any of the departments of the Township over which the Township Administrator has

supervision after consultation with the Township Committee and the department head of each such department.

- 4. Assist in the preparation of the budget, assist the Township Committee in obtaining the necessary data for the preparation of the municipal budget with respect to each department over which the Township Administrator has supervision.
- 5. Investigate all complaints regarding Township services with respect to the departments over which the Township Administrator has supervision and, after consultation with the department head of the services involved, to answer same and report the disposition thereof to the Township Committee.
- 6. Coordinate for the Township Committee the general affairs of the Township with respect to the departments over which the Township Administrator has supervision, including recommendations with respect to purchasing, administration and enforcement of contracts, leases and franchises.
- 7. Attend all meetings as directed and authorized by the Township Committee.
- Perform such other duties as may from time to time be specifically assigned to the Township Administrator by the Township Committee.
- f. **Relationship to Other Officials or Bodies.** Nothing herein contained shall derogate from the powers and duties of the elective, appointive or other officials of the Township of Upper or the boards and commissions thereof established pursuant to law, nor shall the rights and tenure of any elected official be affected.

Section 2-3.1 is hereby amended as follows:

### Section 2-3.1 Department of Public Works.

a. Unchanged.

- b. Management of Department. The day-to-day operations of the Department of Public Works shall be managed and directed by a Superintendent of Public Works, provided that the Township Committee fills this position, and certain subordinate officers consisting of a Road Repairer Supervisor and the Road Repairer 3 under the general supervision of a member of the Township Committee as appointed by the Township Committee and the Township Administrator, if appointed to do so by the Township Committee. There shall also be working foreman/assistant supervisors, including but not limited to Supervising Equipment Operator, Supervising Carpenter, Supervising Maintenance Repairer, Maintenance Worker 3 and Supervisor Recreation Maintenance, who will be responsible for supervising work crew(s) as assigned by the Road Repairer Supervisor and/or Road Repairer 3. Officers and employees shall be appointed by the Township Committee as it deems appropriate and who shall constitute the management of the Department and shall be considered management employees.
- c. Qualifications and Duties of Superintendent.
  - 1. Unchanged.
  - 2. Duties. If this position is filled by the Township Committee, the Superintendent of the Department of Public Works shall take an active role in the supervision of the Department and any Division thereof. The Superintendent shall perform such other duties as the Township Committee may prescribe.
- d. Unchanged.
- e. Unchanged.

Section 2-3.2 is hereby replaced in its entirety with the following:

**2-3.2 Emergency Management.** There shall be a Township Emergency Management Coordinator appointed and serving pursuant to N.J.S.A. App. A:9-40.1. The Township hereby establishes the Department of Emergency Management to be headed by said Township Emergency Management Coordinator subject to the supervision of the Township Administrator, if appointed to do so by the Township Committee, and subject to the overall supervision of the Township Committee member appointed by the Township Committee to supervise and direct this department. The Township also hereby creates, pursuant to and in accordance with N.J.S.A. App. A:9-41, a local emergency management council.

Section 2-3.4 is hereby amended as follows:

### Section 2-3.4 Department of Sports and Recreational Programs.

- a. Unchanged.
- b. Supervision and Management of Programs. The Sports and Recreational Programs shall be generally supervised and directed by one (1) or more members of the Township Committee who shall be appointed by the Township Committee.
- c. Qualifications and Duties of Supervisory Personnel.
  - Qualifications. The Director of the Department shall be a member of the Township Committee duly appointed by the Township Committee. The member(s) of the Township Committee so appointed shall also serve as liaison between the Township Committee and the Township Sports and Recreational Advisory Board, an advisory body created and appointed by the Township Committee.
  - 2. Duties. The member of the Township Committee serving as Director of the Department of Sports and Recreational Programs shall take an active role in the supervision and direction of the Department. The

Recreational Program Coordinator, if the position is filled by the Township Committee, shall supervise and work with those employees as may be assigned to the Department and engaged in performing the necessary tasks for the efficient operation and utilization of the Township's recreational and sports programs.

- d. Unchanged.
- e. Unchanged.

Section 2-3.5 is hereby added as follows:

Section 2-3.5 Establishment of Other Township Departments. The following departments are hereby established by the Township of Upper and each such department shall have a member or members of the Township Committee appointed by the Township Committee to serve as director and head of such department: Public Safety, Buildings and Grounds, Revenue and Finance, Municipal Court, Animal Control, Personnel, Lifeguards, Division of Emergency Medical Services (EMS), Housing, Engineering, Clerk's Office, Zoning and Planning, and Construction Code.

**<u>SECTION 2:</u> <u>EFFECTIVE DATE:</u>** This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption and publication as required by law.

SECTION 3: REPEALER: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency only.

**SECTION 4: SEVERABILITY:** If any section, paragraph, subdivision, subsection, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, subsection, clause or provision declared invalid and the remainder of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect and shall be enforceable.

### **<u>SECTION 5</u>**: <u>CODIFICATION</u>: This Ordinance shall be codified as indicated

in Chapter 2 of the Upper Township Code.

<u>G. TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE MEETING ATTENDANCE</u>: The Township Clerk and the Chief Financial Officer, in lieu of receiving compensatory time for attendance at meetings during non-business hours will receive \$100.00 per meeting.

**<u>H. MILEAGE:</u>** The standard rate per mile in accordance with I.R.S. regulations.

**I. GIFT CARD AWARD OR BONUS:** In addition to the salary set forth in this Ordinance, the Township Committee, by resolution, may award as a bonus any employee a gift card or gift cards not to exceed a total amount of \$200.00 for the year. Said award shall be by resolution of the Township Committee setting forth the amount of the gift card bonus.

**J. EDUCATIONAL CERTIFICATION PAY RAISE:** In addition to the salary set forth in this Ordinance upon resolution of the Township Committee, the Township Committee may give an increase in salary of \$1,000.00 to any employee that has satisfied educational certification requirements for his or her position in accordance with current Township policy. The Township Committee shall by resolution fix the pay increase in this regard and certify that the employee has satisfied the educational certification requirement.

<u>K. ADDITIONAL PAY TO CREW OF SANITATION VEHICLES:</u> Laborers employed in the collection of trash and assigned to the rear of a trash truck shall, in addition to any other compensation payable pursuant to this Ordinance, receive an additional sum to be known as "Hazardous Duty Pay", which shall be payable at the rate of \$.25 per hour.

**L.** ADDITIONAL PAY TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIANS (EMTs): The most senior Emergency Medical Technician assigned to a shift where a supervisory employee is not also assigned to that shift, in addition to any other compensation payable pursuant to this Ordinance, shall receive an additional sum to be known as "Officer in Charge Pay", which shall be payable at the rate of \$.50 per hour.

SECTION 3: <u>LONGEVITY</u>: In addition to the compensation and benefits otherwise payable, certain employees shall be paid an additional sum based on longevity. Any payment based on longevity shall be in accordance with the following schedule:

YEARS OF SERVICE	AMOUNT OF INCREASE BASED ON LONGEVITY
After 5 years	2%
After 10 years	4%
After 15 years	6%
After 20 years	8%
After 25 years	10%

SECTION RESTRICTIONS ON LONGEVITY 3A: **PAYMENTS:** Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 3 hereof, a longevity payment or longevity bonus to any single official, officer or employee of the Township of Upper shall not exceed the sum of Three Thousand (\$3,000.00) Dollars. If, as of January 1, 1997, any such official, officer or employee of the Township of Upper was entitled to a longevity payment in excess of Three Thousand (\$3,000.00) Dollars, then such individual shall be entitled to receive the amount to which he or she would have been entitled as of January 1, 1997 and each such official, officer or employee shall thereafter, in all subsequent years, receive a longevity payment or bonus in the amount paid as of January 1, 1997. In no event shall the amount of longevity payments exceed the sum of Three Thousand (\$3,000.00) Dollars, except for those individuals who are entitled to receive in excess of Three Thousand (\$3,000.00) Dollars as of January 1, 1997 and all such individuals shall in 1997 and all succeeding years be restricted to a payment which does not exceed that which was payable on January 1, 1997.

SECTION 3B: LONGEVITY PAY ABOLISHED FOR CERTAIN EMPLOYEES: Any official, officer or employee who was employed by the Township of Upper on or after January 1, 1996 shall not be entitled to any longevity payment. Longevity pay is abolished for any and all officials, officers and employees hired on or subsequent to that date.

SECTION 4: RESOLUTION AS TO SALARIES: The salaries set forth in this Ordinance are the maximum salaries to be paid for the various positions during 2017 and for such period or periods as this Ordinance shall remain in effect. Such maximum salaries shall be paid for each of the positions indicated unless the Township Committee, by Resolution shall fix a lesser salary, in which event such lesser amount shall be paid.

**SECTION 5: EFFECTIVE DATE OF PAYMENT:** All salaries authorized by this Ordinance shall be paid commencing as follows:

(A) As of January 1, 2017 for all officials, officers and employees of the Township who were employed or appointed as of December 31, 2016. For those officials, officers and employees appointed at the Reorganization Meeting of the Township Committee, such persons shall be deemed appointed and employed by the Township as of January 1, 2017. This provision shall not apply to members of a Collective Bargaining Unit.

- (B) The payment of any salary increment and longevity payment for members of a Collective Bargaining Unit shall be made in accordance with the provisions of the Collective Bargaining Agreement currently in effect, any other provisions herein to the contrary notwithstanding.
- (C) Upon the effective date of appointment for all officers and employees appointed subsequent to January 1, 2017.
- (D) Any salary increases provided for in this Ordinance shall not apply to any official, officer or employee of the Township who has resigned or otherwise terminated his or her employment with the Township of Upper prior to the effective date of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6: REPEALER: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 7: SEVERABILITY: If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence or other part of this Ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance, but shall be confined in its effects to the section, subsection, paragraph, sentence or other part of this Ordinance directly involved in the controversy in which said judgment shall have been rendered and all other provisions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION 8: EFFECTIVE DATE:** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication as required by law.
