APPROVAL OF MINUTES - Sep

September 25, 2017 Regular Meeting and Closed Session Minutes - Motion by Hobie Young,

second by John Coggins, to approve the September 25, 2017 Regular Meeting and Closed Session Minutes as submitted. During roll call vote all four Committeemen present voted in the affirmative.

REPORT OF GOVERNING BODY MEMBERS

Curtis Corson, Committeemen, reported that the Upper Township Fire Prevention Night will be held tomorrow evening October 11, 2017 from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. at the Marmora Fire House. He next reported that the Township will hold a free rabies clinic on Saturday October 21, 2017 from 1:00 pm to 3:00 p.m. at the Shore Veterinarians Animal Clinic, dog licenses will also be available for purchase at the clinic. He next reported that the Upper Township Historical Society will be holding their Apple Festival on Saturday October 14, 2017, rain date on Sunday October 15, 2017 from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the Gandy Farm in Seaville. Lastly Mr. Corson questioned the engineer as to why the old street lights throughout the downtown Tuckahoe area have not been removed since the new street lights are now operational. Motion by Curtis Corson, second by Ed Barr to authorize the engineer to have the old street lights in the downtown Tuckahoe area removed.

Hobie Young, Committeeman, questioned if the DPW crack sealing project included the Tennis Courts at Caldwell Park. Mr. Morgan explained that the materials needed for the Tennis Courts is a different substance and will be included in the next round of crack sealing.

Mr. Young next reported on the Baseball Field improvements at Amanda's Field and the Fall Fest and Pumpkin Run event scheduled for November 4, 2017 at Amanda's Field. Lastly Mr. Young discussed safety concerns with the site triangle at the intersection of Dennisville-Petersburg Road and State Highway Route 50 and requested that a resolution requesting the designation of "No Turn on Red" in all directions at that intersection be placed on the next agenda. Motion by Hobie Young second by John Coggins to place a resolution on the next agenda requesting the NJDOT to designate "No Turn on Red" in all directions at the intersection of County Route 610 (Dennisville Petersburg Road) and NJ State Highway Route 50 in Petersburg. During roll call vote all four Committeemen present voted in the affirmative.

Edward Barr, Committeeman, reported that he was informed by Cape May County Freeholders Pierson and Morey that in light of the Strathmere residents' concerns with the proposed installation of rumble strips on Commonwealth Avenue the County will not be taking action on the installation of the rumble strips on Commonwealth Avenue in Strathmere.

OTHER REPORTS

Scott Morgan, Municipal Administrator, reported that the department of public works is currently working on a crack sealing project, and are finishing up on Heritage Drive, Chadwynn, Berwynn, Gladwynn Drive and Luke Court and will continue as the weather allows. He also reported that the department of public works have delivered thirty six of the forty commercial trash dumpster that were purchased. Lastly, he requested promotions for Stewart Segin to Equipment Operator and Pete Buganski to Truck Driver. The CFO explained that the title adjustments will not impact the budget because the employees are at the high end of the salary scale this adjustment will bring them down to approximately \$200 below their annual salary. Motion by Curtis Corson, second by John Coggins to appoint Stewart Segin as Equipment Operator and Pete Buganski as Truck Driver in the Department of Public Works effective October 27, 2017.

Barbara Young, Municipal Clerk, requested permission to renew the Townships Commercial Bingo Hall Rentor's License for the Upper Township Community Center which will expire at the end of the year. Motion by Hobie Young, second by John Coggins to renew the Commercial Bingo Hall Rentor's License for the Upper Township Community Center. During roll call vote all four Committeemen present voted in the affirmative. She next invited everyone to attend the Upper Township Health Fair scheduled for this Thursday October 12, 2017 from 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. at the Upper Township Community Center.

Daniel Young, Municipal Attorney, reported that there are, personnel, potential litigation, safety and security and contract negotiation items for closed session.

Paul Dietrich, Municipal Engineer, reported that the Upper Township Green Team has attained their Bronze re-certification for Sustainable Jersey and will be recognized next month at the New Jersey League of Municipalities Conference in Atlantic City. He next reported that the Strathmere Boat Ramp repairs are complete and the ramp is ready for the next season. Lastly, he reported materials have been ordered for the Webster Avenue Bulkhead repairs and the bid opening for the Webster Avenue Park Improvements is scheduled for October 17, 2017 at 2:00 p.m.

Barbara Spiegel, Chief Financial Officer, reported that as part of the boat ramp project the Township applied for a NJDEP Coastal Resiliency Grant to help construct a living shore line. One of the grant requirements was a \$15,000 matching grant with the Township, when the Township initially applied for the grant we had to designate where the funds would be used, at that time we determined that the grant funds would be used for construction. Since that time some of the funds were needed for consulting services, which now requires a line adjustment for bookkeeping purposes. The CFO explained that there is no change in dollar amounts, it is merely a booking matter which requires authorization from the Mayor and CFO in order to make adjustment. Motion by John Coggins, second by Curtis Corson to Authorize the Mayor and CFO to sign and submit the paperwork for the adjustment to the line items under the NJDEP Coastal Resiliency Grant. During roll call vote all four Committeemen voted in the affirmative.

accommodation of all road users, existing roadway conditions, the scope of the project, and the

surrounding environment when applying information and guidance on rumble strips; and

WHEREAS, the FHA directs that the use of rumbles should be determined based on

the merit of the cross-section and appropriate to the setting such that characteristics and concerns that often limit the usefulness or application include low speeds, noise for adjacent residences, pavement

width, presence of curb and gutter, and significant turning movements or other conflicts of both

motorists and other road users; and

WHEREAS, operational and safety performance can be impacted by vehicles

attempting to shift away from rumble strips when lane widths are too narrow, potentially into

adjacent lanes or the shoulder affecting the safety of other drivers, as well as non-motorized users

such as bicyclists and pedestrians who may be using the adjacent lane or shoulder; and

WHEREAS, rumble strip installations may also produce noise complaints when

there are nearby residences, particularly when issues such as numbers of large vehicles, narrow lane

widths, cars parked along road, bicyclists, curves, or significant passing or turning maneuvers

combine: and

WHEREAS, in order to insure the safety of residents and the general public, and to

keep noise pollution from adversely affecting the quality of life for the residents, the Township

Committee of the Township of Upper does not support the installation of rumble strips along roads in

the Township of Upper with a speed limit below 50 mph; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the

Township of Upper, in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section Four. The Township hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section Five. This ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.
