<u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u> - November 19, 2018 Regular Meeting and Closed Session Minutes

Motion by Richard Palombo, second by John Coggins, to approve the November 19, 2018 Regular Meeting and Closed Session Minutes as submitted. During roll call vote three Committeemen voted in the affirmative. Committeemen Corson and Young abstained.

REPORT OF GOVERNING BODY MEMBERS

Hobie Young, Committeeman, requested a meeting with Scott Morgan to go over plans for the leased property at 18 Sunset Drive. He next reported that he has received several calls regarding the Governor's plan to make New Jersey a sanctuary state. He stated that the Township should submit its position on the issue to the Governor.

Curtis Corson, Committeeman, reported that he recently became a Grandfather! The members of the Committee congratulated Committeeman Corson.

Richard Palombo, Mayor, reported that the Tree Lighting ceremony was a great success. He next wished everyone a happy holiday season and encouraged everyone to remember those that are less fortunate and to help in any way possible.

OTHER REPORTS

Scott Morgan, Township Administrator, reported that the Township's EMAA grant submission process has been completed and he anticipates receiving the grant money soon. He next acknowledged Committeeman Young for his direction on the beautification and holiday decoration of the Town Hall building and grounds. He thanked the Public Works Department and Municipal Clerk Barbara Young for their work executing the plans. He next gave an update on the leaf collection progress, and stated that the Township website will have regular updates on the progress. Lastly, he reported that the Computer Aided Dispatch system for Upper Township has been installed and training for employees will begin on Thursday.

Daniel Young, Municipal Attorney, reported that there will be a number of items for closed session.

Paul Dietrich, Township Engineer, reported that the contractor will be completing the dune fence in Strathmere this week. He next reported that the Army Corps of Engineers has appropriated 12 million dollars for a beach replenishment project which will include southern Ocean City, Strathmere, and Sea Isle. Over the coming months they will be determining the extent of fill each area of the project will require, and the Township will be responsible for 25% of the State's 50% match. Last, Mr. Dietrich requested authorization to have the Mayor sign and submit letters to the Army Corps of Engineers requesting planning assistance for the New Jersey Coastal Coalition's flood mitigation. Motion by Curtis Corson, second by Edward Barr, to approve the request. During roll call vote all five Committeemen voted in the affirmative.

PRESENTATION

1. **Cape May County Mosquito Control Commission.** Freeholder Jeffrey Pierson introduced Entomologist Kyle Rossner of the Cape May County Mosquito Control Commission. Mr. Rossner gave an informative presentation regarding the Mosquito Control Commission's proactive surveillance and control operations, and described ways that residents can assist in limiting and preventing the breeding grounds for mosquitos.

Freeholder Pierson also reported that he and Freeholder Hayes will be hosting a County Coffee Chat event on December 10th from 9 to 11 am at the Dunkin Donuts in Marmora. The event is open to all residents.

Loss Contingency Fund; and

9. Public hearing and final adoption of Ordinance No. 018-2018 RE: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCE CHAPTER XVII (CONSTRUCTION OF BULKHEADS) OF THE CODE OF UPPER TOWNSHIP. During the public hearing portion, Ted Kingston of Strathmere spoke in favor of the Ordinance. Mayor Palombo then closed the public hearing portion. Motion by Curtis Corson, second by Edward Barr to adopt Ordinance 018-2018. During roll call vote all five Committeemen voted in the affirmative.

TOWNSHIP OF UPPER CAPE MAY COUNTY ORDINANCE

ORDINANCE NO. 018-2018

RE: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCE CHAPTER XVII (CONSTRUCTION OF BULKHEADS) OF THE CODE OF UPPER TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS, the Township Committee desires to amend the ordinance regulating the construction of bulkheads; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee desires make the Strathmere bulkhead more resilient to flooding and protect property from storm surge; and

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee, in the Township of Upper, County of Cape May and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 17 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Upper, also known as the Code of Upper Township, shall be amended as hereinafter provided:

CHAPTER 17. CONSTRUCTION OF BULKHEADS

- **17-1 PURPOSE.** No change.
- 17.2 BULKHEAD REQUIRED. No change.
- **17.3 PERMIT REQUIRED.** No Change.
- **17-4 PERMIT APPROVALS.** No Change.
- 17-5 NOTIFICATION OF COMMENCEMENT OF CONSTRUCTION. No Change.
- **17-6 FINAL INSPECTION.** No Change.
- 17-7 STATE AND FEDERAL APPROVALS. No Change.

Revise Section 17-8 MINIMUM SPECIFICATIONS as follows:

The minimum specifications for construction, reconstruction, repair or renovation of bulkheads are as follows:

- a. Bulkhead design shall provide for expected toe scour or proposed dredge depth and shall be shown on plans.
- b. Non-Oceanfront Bulkheads
 - 1. The minimum elevation of the top of the bulkhead shall be as follows:
 - (a) Along Strathmere Bay (Blocks 825, 826, 841, 842, 849 and 850): 8.0' NAVD, 1988 Datum.
 - (b) Along Strathmere Bay (Blocks 750, 756, 757 and 762): 8.0' NAVD, 1988 Datum.
 - (c) Along Great Egg Harbor (Block 479, 682 and 735): 10.0' NAVD, 1988 Datum.
 - (d) Along Tuckahoe River (Block 12, 15, 19 and 310): one (1') above the existing bank along the spring high tide line.
 - (e) Along Tuckahoe River (Block 348): 9.0' NAVD, 1988 Datum.
 - 2. Additional outfall piping requires written approval from the Municipal Engineer. If drainage conditions require piping, all new infrastructure must have an approved tide-control device.
 - 3. Existing privately owned outfall piping will be extended and fitted with an approved tide-control device.
 - 4. Existing Township owned storm drains that penetrate private bulkheads shall be extended and maintained by the private property owner.
 - 5. Bulkhead construction shall not adversely effect the depth of the adjacent water body.
- c. Oceanfront Bulkheads
 - 1. Oceanfront Bulkheads shall be required when adjacent to the Atlantic Ocean and extending along Corson's Inlet to the Corson's Inlet Bridge.
 - 2. The minimum elevation of the top of the bulkhead shall be 11.0' NAVD, 1988 datum. The existing timber bulkhead along the oceanfront shall be considered grandfathered as meeting these standards.
 - 3. If the proposed construction methods shall require access and/or disturbance of Township property, a detailed plan outlining the proposed limits of disturbance and proposed restoration shall be provided for approval by the Township Engineer. Township property shall be restored to a condition equal to preconstruction conditions.

17-9 PERFORMANCE STANDARDS. No Change.

17-10 UTILITIES. No Change.

Replace Section 17-11 MAINTENANCE, DUTY TO REPAIR with the following:

17-11 MAINTENANCE, DUTY TO REPAIR AND REPLACE.

- a. All private bulkheads within the Township of Upper shall be maintained so they shall not pose a danger to the health, safety or welfare of the citizens of the Township of Upper or to property within the Township of Upper. The bulkheads shall be kept in a state of repair to prevent erosion or damage to abutting, adjacent or adjoining properties. Whenever a bulkhead has deteriorated to such a degree that it poses a danger to the property, or adjoining properties, or a bulkhead has not been constructed in conformance with this ordinance by January 1, 2029 as required by 17-11b. below, the Municipal Engineer shall notify the property owner, in writing, of the nature of the deterioration or violation and require the owner to make the necessary repairs or construction. Said repairs or construction shall be made in conformance with this Chapter. The property owner shall submit a plan of corrective action to the Municipal Engineer no later than thirty (30) days from receipt of the notice. Upon approval of the corrective action by the Municipal Engineer, the property owner shall complete all necessary repairs or construction forthwith. If permits are required from the State of New Jersey or the Federal government, such permits shall be immediately applied for. In the event the property owner fails to submit a corrective action plan or fails to implement that plan, he shall be liable for the penalties and violations contained herein.
- b. Any property listed in 17-8b1(a) above must have a bulkhead constructed in conformance with this Chapter 17 by January 1, 2029.

17-12 VIOLATION; PENALTIES. No Change.

SECTION 2: EFFECTIVE DATE: This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon

adoption and publication as required by law.

SECTION 3: REPEALER: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent

herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency only.

SECTION 4: SEVERABILITY: If any section, paragraph, subdivision, subsection,

clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the

section, paragraph, subdivision, subsection, clause or provision declared invalid and the remainder of this

Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect and shall be enforceable.

SECTION 5: CODIFICATION: This Ordinance shall be codified as indicated in

Chapters 17 of the Upper Township Code.
