# CALL TO ORDER

## SUNSHINE ANNOUNCEMENT

Tonight's meeting is being audio recorded up until the closed session portion of this meeting and will be available on the Upper Township website. I hereby direct that this announcement be made a part of the minutes of this meeting."

APPROVAL OF MINUTES - May 26, 2020 Regular and Closed Session Minutes

Motion by Edward Barr, second by John Coggins, to approve the May 26, 2020 Regular Session Minutes as submitted. During roll call vote all five Committeemen voted in the affirmative.

# **REPORT OF GOVERNING BODY MEMBERS**

**John Coggins, Committeeman,** stated that the proposed 2020 capital bond will be part of the 5 to 10 year capital needs budget.

**Hobie Young, Committeeman,** reported that he received an inquiry from an owner of a tattoo parlor in Upper Township as to when he will be able to open. It was stated that the Township needs to follow the Governor's executive orders. If a tattoo parlor is considered a salon then they will be able to open on June  $22^{nd}$ .

**Edward Barr, Committeeman,** thanked the residents for their patience while the Department of Public Works was on a flexible schedule due to the pandemic.

**Curtis Corson, Committeeman,** reported that there was a section of Route 50 closed because of road work this past weekend, however the fire companies and EMS were never notified. It was stated that it may have been an emergency road closure.

**Richard Palombo, Mayor,** reported that the grand opening for the Great Egg Harbor Bay pedestrian and bicycle path project has been postponed again to July 8, 2020, pending the Governor lifting the stay at home order. Next, he reported that at the last meeting there was a discussion of the school utilizing Township property for the eighth-grade graduation. However, due to State guidelines, they will need to use their own property. The graduation will take place on July 9<sup>th</sup> at the Middle School fields. Next, he reported that the Strathmere 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade has officially been cancelled due to the ongoing pandemic and Governor's restrictions. Last, he made a motion to hire 5 rookie guards. Three of the guards, Nathaniel Minor, Alex Lopacinski, and Cody Liepe, are to be hired contingent upon successful pre-employment testing. Two of the guards, Aiden Fisher and Kailey Grimley, to be hired contingent upon meeting the age requirements. The motion was seconded by Edward Barr. During roll call vote all five Committeemen voted in the affirmative.

# **OTHER REPORTS**

**Scott Morgan, Township Administrator**, gave a brief status report on the total Covid-19 cases in New Jersey, Cape May County, and Upper Township. He next reported that on June 4<sup>th</sup> Governor Murphy extended the public health emergency order for an additional 30 days. He urged everyone to continue to follow CDC guidelines regarding hand washing, mask wearing, and social distancing. Next he thanked the Cape May County Office of Emergency Management for sending another delivery of PPE for the Division of EMS. He also stated that the Township has also ordered and recently hand sanitizer solution and dispensers, which have been placed in Township buildings, at many of the beach crossovers and common areas in Strathmere, and the boat ramps. He stated that once the recreation areas start to open sanitizer stations will be placed there as well. Last, he reported that the Department of Public Works is now working at full capacity and thanked the employees for doing an excellent job while working the flex schedule. Later in the meeting, he reported that Ocean City through their purchasing cooperative will be purchasing snow fence and post and rail. He stated that the Township is in need of post and rail for several projects and requested approval to join in with the purchasing co-op. After a brief discussion, there was a general consensus to approve joining the purchasing co-op for post and rail if funds are available

**Barbara Young, Municipal Clerk**, reported on the procedures for the upcoming Primary Election in that per Governor Murphy's Orders No. 120 and No. 144 the July 7 Primary Election will be held primarily by mail. She explained that the county is currently mailing out Vote-by-Mail Ballots to active Democratic and Republican voters and Unaffiliated and Inactive Voters will receive an application for a Vote-by-Mail ballot which is specific to this primary. The procedure for Disabled voters was also explained. Lastly, she explained that Upper Township will have two polling locations open on Election Day; the Upper Township Community Center and the Second Cape May Baptist Church where voters will be able to vote a paper provisional ballot.

**Paul Dietrich, Township Engineer**, reported that the County project for Corson's Tavern Road has begun, and for the next several weeks they will be working on drainage. He expects to receive regular updates from the County Engineer and will pass along the information to the Committee and residents. He next reported that the roundabout at Woodbine/Ocean View Road and Dennisville/Petersburg Road will be closed from 6:00 pm to 6:00 am on June 8<sup>th</sup> for paving.

**Barbara Ludy, Chief Financial Officer**, reported that she was recently notified of the need for various capital purchases totaling approximately \$100,000. She stated that there are still funds in the 2018 bond that have not been appropriated. She stated that upon approval by the Committee, she can request bond counsel to repurpose the remaining funds in the 2018 bond.
