APPROVAL OF MINUTES - April 12, 2021 Regular and Closed Session Minutes

Motion by Edward Barr, second by Kimberly Hayes, to approve the April 12, 2021 Regular Meeting and Closed Session Minutes as submitted. During roll call vote five Committee members voted in the affirmative.

REPORT OF GOVERNING BODY MEMBERS

John Coggins, Committeeman, complimented the Department of Public Works regarding the appearance of Caldwell Park. He next reported a safety concern regarding the site triangle at the intersection of Church Road and Route 9 and requested that the concern be investigated, and the appropriate county and state officials be notified. Last, he reported on recent serious allegations that have come against Ocean City High School for the alleged failure of the school to protect students from bullying, harassment, and assault. He made a motion, second by Kimberly Hayes, to send a letter from the Township Committee to the Ocean City Board of Education requesting a full investigation of the allegations. During roll call vote all five Committee members voted in the affirmative.

Kimberly Hayes, Committeewoman, reported that there are a few ongoing issues with several tennis courts in the Township, and she is working with the Administrator and Public Works on addressing the

issues. She next reported that the Upper Township Business Association will be holding a free shredding event on Saturday May 1st at Foglios Flooring Center from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm.

Curtis Corson, Committeeman, commended Scott Fancher, Matt Steinthal, Melissa Blackledge, and John Carter of the Upper Township Division of EMS for going above and beyond during two recent calls.

OTHER REPORTS

Scott Morgan, Township Administrator, gave a brief update on the latest information from the CMC Health Department regarding Covid-19. He next gave a brief update on the Governor's new executive order regarding increased capacity limits for indoor and outdoor events beginning May 10, 2021.

Barbara Young, Township Clerk, reported that the Township will be holding a virtual National Day of Prayer ceremony on Thursday May 6th at 10:00 am. Information on how to attend is available on the Upper Township website.

Daniel Young, Township Attorney, reported that the Township has received an invitation from the federal Bureau of Ocean Energy Management to become a consulting party regarding the proposed Ocean Wind Offshore Wind Farm Construction. It is his recommendation that the Township become a consulting party and appoint a subcommittee to attend the meetings and protect and address the Township's interests in between Committee meetings. After a brief discussion, there was a motion by Richard Palombo, second by Kimberly Hayes, to become a consulting party to the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management's review of the proposed Ocean Wind Offshore Wind Farm, to appoint John Coggins and Kimberly Hayes as the members of the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management consulting party subcommittee, and confirm that the current members of the subcommittee regarding the redevelopment of the former BL England property remain as John Coggins and Richard Palombo. During roll call vote all five Committee members voted in the affirmative.

Paul Dietrich, Township Engineer, reported that the work at Beesley's Point Park is coming along, however there are a few issues regarding quantities in the original contract, and he will be working with the CFO to prepare a contract amendment for additional quantities for work and materials. He next reported that there will be a small area in Petersburg that will be sprayed for gypsy moths in the coming weeks.

TOWNSHIP OF UPPER CALENDAR YEAR 2021 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (<u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A: 4-45.14)

ORDINANCE NO. 008-2021

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.5%

unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to **3.5%** over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the **3.5%** percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Upper in the County of Cape May finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2021 budget by up to **3.5%** over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Upper hereby determines that a 1.0 % increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$120,301.44 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the Township Committee of the Township of Upper hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated, as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Upper, in the County of Cape May a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2021 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Upper shall, in accordance with this ordinance and <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by **3.5 %**, amounting to \$ **\$421,055.04** and that the CY 2021 municipal budget for the Township of Upper be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

RE: AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING SALE OF LANDS, TO WIT BLOCK 414, LOT 39.12

WHEREAS, the Township of Upper is the owner, in fee, of a certain parcel of vacant ground located within the Township of Upper, County of Cape May, and State of New Jersey, set forth on the municipal tax map as Block 414, Lot 39.12; and

WHEREAS, the Township has received an offer from Stephen G. Schaffer, the owner

of real property contiguous with said parcel owned by the Township, to purchase said parcel; and

WHEREAS, after discussion and deliberation the Township Committee is of the

opinion that the sale of said parcel will be in the best interest of the Township and will provide for the consolidation of said lot with an existing lot; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee in the

Township of Upper, County of Cape May and State of New Jersey as follows:

<u>SECTION 1</u>: The Township of Upper is hereby authorized to sell the real property commonly known as follows:

Block 414, Lot 39.12

to the highest bidder from among all owners of real property contiguous thereto in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13(b)(5). Such sale shall not be for less than the fair market value of said real property and the minimum bid for such parcel sold is hereby established as follows:

Minimum Bid: \$3,000.00

<u>SECTION 2</u>: Prior to said sale, the Township will obtain a title report from a title company or abstract company licensed to do business in the State of New Jersey. Said report shall be available to all prospective bidders.

SECTION 3: The list of property authorized to be sold together with the minimum price thereof shall be posted at Township Hall and advertisement of the sale shall be made in a newspaper circulating in the Township within 5 days following enactment of this ordinance. Offers for the property may thereafter be made to the Township Committee for 20 days following said advertisement. The Township Committee may reconsider this ordinance not later than 30 days after enactment and thereafter advertise the property for public sale pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13(a). The Township Clerk shall file with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs sworn affidavits verifying the publication of the foregoing advertisements.

SECTION 4: Stephen G. Schaffer shall pay the following sum to the Township Clerk prior to the adoption of this Ordinance: \$500.00. This payment will be used by the Township and defray Township expenses involved in Authorizing the Sale and terms thereof; Engineer's review; Attorney's review; legal advertising, certified mail notices, title review expenses, closing costs and other expenses. If the parcel is not sold, this amount will be retained by the Township as **LIQUIDATED DAMAGES** and will be used to pay for the review of the title report and other documents. If the highest bidder at the auction sale is <u>not</u> the original applicant, the highest bidder will be required to pay, in addition to the purchase price and other expenses, an additional sum of \$500.00, representing pre-sale amounts paid by the original applicant requesting the sale and the original applicant (who is not the highest bidder) will then be entitled to a refund of all sums paid (\$500.00) except for the non-refundable application fee (\$50.00).

SECTION 5: The aforesaid parcel of real property shall be offered for sale at an auction to be conducted by the Township Clerk at a date and time to be set by the Township Clerk after the appropriate notice of sale has been sent to contiguous owners of the subject real property. Said notice shall be sent certified and regular mail to the owners of contiguous property at the address set forth on the tax assessor's records. Said notice shall be sent no greater than 30 days prior to the date of sale and no less than 14 days prior to the date of sale. At any time, the Township Clerk may adjourn said sale and renotice in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13.

SECTION 6: The Township Committee expressly reserves the right to reject any and all bids in the exercise of its sole judgment and discretion. The Township Committee is authorized to confirm the sale by resolution and complete the transaction pursuant to this Ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13.

<u>SECTION 7</u>: In the event the highest bid at such auction exceeds the minimum bid established herein and the Township Committee rejects same in the exercise of its sole judgment and discretion, then, in such event, all deposits made by the original applicant or the highest bidder, as the case may be, shall be refunded except for the \$50.00 application fee which shall be non-refundable.

SECTION 8: All payments required to be made pursuant to said sale to the Township Clerk must be made by personal check, cash or certified check, or any combination of the foregoing. All payments required to be made hereunder to a title company or abstract company conducting the closing shall be made in collected funds, that is, by cash, certified check, cashier's check or wire transfer.

SECTION 9: A sum equal to ten percent (10%) of the highest bid for said parcel or parcels shall be paid to the Township of Upper by the highest bidder or bidders at the time of the sale. The remaining balance of ninety percent (90%) of the highest bid for the parcel or parcels shall be paid to the Township of Upper, and must be received by the Township Clerk, not later than thirty (30) days after the date of the sale. In addition to the deposit of ten percent (10%), the highest bidder or bidders shall also be required to pay or tender at the time of sale the following:

IF THE BIDDER IS THE ORIGINAL APPLICANT:

AT THE TIME OF CLOSING the successful bidder shall be required to pay the following sums:

- (D) Any additional sum required for title search or title insurance.
- (E) The cost of any survey ordered by the successful bidder. Successful bidder shall place such order directly with the surveyor or with the title company conducting closing, but the survey must be prepared in time to permit the closing to take place as scheduled.
- (F) Title company settlement fees covering services to both the Seller and the Buyer.
- (G) Any additional fees or costs chargeable by the title company or otherwise necessary to complete the transaction on behalf of the purchaser.

<u>SECTION 10</u>: The closing of title shall take place as designated by the Township as follows:

- (B) Office of the Township Solicitor; or

SECTION 11: If the bidder fails to close or fails to comply with the provisions hereof, such bidder shall be in default and all amounts paid to the Township by or on behalf of the bidder shall be retained by the Township as LIQUIDATED DAMAGES AND NOT AS A PENALTY.

SECTION 12: The Deed from the Township of Upper shall be what is commonly known as a Quitclaim Deed.

SECTION 14: The title to be delivered by the Township shall be under and subject to all easements and rights of way, recorded and unrecorded, whether for utilities or for others, and shall also be subject to all conditions, reservations and restrictions of record, if any. If the title report discloses an unmarketable condition of title, except as specified herein, the remedy of the bidder shall be limited to the return of payments made to the Township of Upper on account of the purchase price and closing costs only. Any and all other amounts paid to the Township shall be non-refundable. This sale is under and subject to any riparian claim which may affect said property. If any such claim exists, it shall be the sole responsibility of the purchaser to meet and satisfy all requirements of the State of New Jersey with respect to said riparian claim and the payment of any compensation to the State of New Jersey on account thereof. Nothing herein shall be construed as obligating the Township of Upper to construct or maintain access roads to any portion of the property being sold. The purchaser is required to comply with all applicable zoning, building and health ordinances and codes and regulations. The property being sold may be situated in a Flood Hazard Zone. The Township of Upper makes no warranties or representations, expressed or implied, as to the property being offered for sale, the condition or marketability of the title or any other matter. The Township of Upper makes no warranties or representations, expressed or implied, as to whether or not the property being offered for sale contains wetlands anywhere on the property. The Township makes no warranties or representations as to any matter of an environmental nature, or otherwise, which may prevent or limit building or construction.

SECTION 15: All references to Lots and Blocks described herein are to the Lots and Blocks as shown on the Current Official Tax Map of the Township of Upper.

SECTION 16: The successful bidder shall be required, at the time of the sale, to execute a document acknowledging that the sale is governed by the provisions of this Ordinance as well as N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13.

<u>SECTION 17</u>: The provisions of this Ordinance pertaining to this sale shall survive the closing of title and shall not merge into the Deed.

<u>SECTION 18</u>: It is a requirement of this sale that the purchaser of the subject property

17. Anthony Jackson request for speed hump on Stagecoach Road in the vicinity of 1526 Stagecoach Road. The Township engineer reported that data collected from a recent speed study of the area reported that the average speed was 34.69mph, and the high speed was 54mph. There were 118 vehicles that exceeded 45mph out of the 3,450 vehicles during this period or 3.4%. He stated that based on this study, speed humps are not warranted and recommend that the information be sent over to the NJ State Police so that they can utilize the data to help determine best times for enforcement in that area. After a lengthy discussion, the engineer was directed to send the study data to the State Police and request an increase in patrols and obtain price quotes and information regarding solar powered speed signs. The matter will be relisted under unfinished business on a future agenda.

It was stated that the Township has contracted with a KD National Force Security for parking enforcement. The Towing Ordinance was adopted and bid specifications are being prepared. It was stated that the Township is coordinating a non-emergency number with the Ocean City for residents to report parking issues and have held several operational meetings with KD National Force Security.

Linda Bateman, Tecumseh Avenue, thanked the Committee for their stance on anti-bullying and willingness to send a letter to the Ocean City Board of Education to call for an investigation of the allegations. She also spoke about the investigation of harassment allegations against the Ocean City Beach Patrol and inquired if there are measures in place to protect the members of the Upper Township Beach Patrol. It was stated that the Township has a very specific detailed personnel policy and procedures regarding any type of harassment, and any allegations of such can be reported to a Supervisor, the Personnel Office, or the Township Solicitor. Ms. Bateman next spoke about the overcrowding and plans for expansion at the Deauville.
