RESOLUTION NO. 027-2024

RE: AFFIRMING THE TOWNSHIP OF UPPER'S
CIVIL RIGHTS POLICY WITH RESPECT TO ALL OFFICIALS,
APPOINTEES, EMPLOYEES, PROSPECTIVE EMPLOYEES, VOLUNTEERS,
INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS, AND MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC THAT COME INTO
CONTACT WITH MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES,
OFFICIALS AND VOLUNTEERS

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Township of Upper to treat the public, employees, prospective employees, appointees, volunteers and contractors in a manner consistent with all applicable civil rights laws and regulations including, but not limited to the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964 as subsequently amended, the New Jersey Law against Discrimination, the Americans with Disabilities Act and the Conscientious Employee Protection Act, and

WHEREAS, the governing body of the of the Township of Upper has determined that certain procedures need to be established to accomplish this policy; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED to affirm and adopt the Township of Upper's civil rights policy as follows:

Section 1: No official, employee, appointee or volunteer of the Township of Upper by whatever title known, or any entity that is in any way a part of the Township of Upper shall engage, either directly or indirectly in any act including the failure to act that constitutes discrimination, harassment or a violation of any person's constitutional rights while such official, employee, appointee volunteer, or entity is engaged in or acting on behalf of the Township of Upper's business or using the facilities or property of the Township of Upper.

Section 2: The prohibitions and requirements of this resolution shall extend to any person or entity, including but not limited to any volunteer organization or inter-local organization, whether structured as a governmental entity or a private entity, that receives authorization or support in any way from the Township of Upper to provide services that otherwise could be performed by the Township of Upper.

Section 3: Discrimination, harassment and civil rights shall be defined for purposes of this resolution using the latest definitions contained in the applicable Federal and State laws concerning discrimination, harassment and civil rights.

Section 4: The Township Committee shall establish written procedures for any person to report alleged discrimination, harassment and violations of civil rights prohibited by this resolution. Such procedures shall include alternate ways to report a complaint so that the person making the complaint need not communicate with the alleged violator in the event the alleged violator would be the normal contact for such complaints.

Section 5: No person shall retaliate against any person who reports any alleged discrimination, harassment or violation of civil rights, provided however, that any person who reports alleged violations in bad faith shall be subject to appropriate discipline.

Section 6: The Personnel Officer shall establish written procedures that require all officials, employees, appointees and volunteers of the Township of Upper as well as all other entities subject to this resolution to periodically complete training concerning their duties, responsibilities and rights pursuant to this resolution.

Section 7: The Personnel Officer shall establish a system to monitor compliance and shall report at least annually to the governing body the results of the monitoring.

Section 8: At least annually, the Personnel Officer shall cause a summary of this resolution and the procedures established pursuant to this resolution to be communicated within the Township of Upper. This communication shall include a statement from the governing body expressing its unequivocal commitment to enforce this resolution. This summary shall also be posted on the Township of Upper's web site.

Section 9: This resolution shall take effect immediately.

Section 10: A copy of this resolution shall be published in the official newspaper of the Township of Upper in order for the public to be made aware of this policy and the Township of Upper's commitment to the implementation and enforcement of this policy.

WHEREAS, the Township wishes to amend Resolution 367-2023 to fix the expiration date of the Agreement for Solid Waste Disposal and Recycling Services to occur on December 31, 2025; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq., the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, authorizes a municipality to enter into a contract with any other local unit for the sharing of governmental services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the Township of Upper, County of Cape May, and State of New Jersey, as follows:

WHEREAS, mutual aid and assistance agreements between municipalities, counties, law enforcement, Public Works, Community Emergency Response Teams (CERT), Medical Reserve Corps (MRC), Construction Officials, Emergency Medical Services ("EMS"), fire departments, volunteer fire companies and/or EMS organizations or Fire Districts, are permitted pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A: 14-26

WHEREAS, the President of the United States, in Homeland Security Presidential Directive 5 ("HSPD-5" or the "Presidential Directive"), directed the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security ("DHS") to develop and administer a National Incident Management System ("NIMS"), which would provide a consistent nationwide approach to Federal, State, local and tribal governments to work together more effectively and efficiently to prevent, prepare for, respond to and recover from domestic incidents, regardless of cause, size or complexity; and

WHEREAS, then-Acting Governor Richard J. Codey, in his Executive Order No. 50, dated August 5, 2005 (the "Executive Order"), implemented NIMS as the state standard for incident management and directed its use for all emergency incidents in the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, "The New Jersey Civilian Defense and Disaster Control Act", N.J.S.A. App. A:9-30 et seq. (the "Disaster Control Act"), provides for the health, safety and welfare of the people of the State of New Jersey during any emergency by centralizing control of all civilian activities having to do with such emergency in the Governor, who shall have authority over the resources of each and every political subdivision of the State to cope with any condition that shall arise out of such emergency; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the Disaster Control Act, the "Fire Service Resource Emergency Deployment Act," N.J.S.A. 52:14E-11 et seq. (the "Fire Service Act") establishing a mechanism for the coordination of fire service resources throughout the State to facilitate a quick and efficient response to any emergency incident or situation that requires the immediate deployment of those resources in order to protect life and property from the danger or destruction of fire, explosion or other disaster; and

WHEREAS, the Director of the Division of Fire Safety in the Department of Community Affairs promulgated rules commonly referred to as the "Fire Service Resource Emergency Deployment Regulations" N.J.A.C. 5:75A-1.1 et seq. (the "Fire Service Regulations"), and N.J.A.C. 5:75A-2.2 specifically requires each municipality or fire district to adopt a local fire mutual aid plan; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed to be in the best interests of the residents of the Township of Upper to enter into a mutual aid and assistance agreement with the County of Cape May and other municipalities including (but not limited to) municipal Office of Emergency Management, police, Emergency Medical Service or fire departments, volunteer fire companies or EMS organizations and/or fire districts to provide additional protection against loss, damage or destruction by fire, catastrophe, civil unrest, major emergency or other extraordinary devastation damage or destruction to person and property, in those situations when outside aid and assistance is needed.

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Upper, in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. The allegations of the preamble are incorporated herein by this reference.
- 2. The Mayor and Township Clerk, on behalf of the Township of Upper, are hereby authorized and directed to execute the attached Intra-County Mutual Aid and Assistance Agreement between the County of Cape May and all Participating Entities.
- 3. All Township officials and officers are hereby authorized and empowered to take all action deemed necessary or advisable to carry into effect the intent and purpose of this Resolution.

WHEREAS, in the best interests its residents, the Township of Upper has agreed to enter into a host community benefit agreement for a one year term to allow negotiations to continue; and

WHEREAS, the term of said agreement shall be effective on January 1, 2024 and shall terminate on December 31, 2024; and
